<u>Scripture references</u>: **Deuteronomy 6:5-7** tells us to: "⁵Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. ⁶These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. ⁷Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

Deuteronomy 11:13-14, "¹³And it shall come to pass, if ye shall hearken diligently unto my commandments which I command you this day, to love the LORD your God, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul, ¹⁴That I will give you the rain of your land in his due season, the first rain and the latter rain, that thou mayest gather in thy corn, and thy wine, and thine oil."

These scriptures are also affirmed in the New Testament in the teaching of Christ in *Matthew 22:37*, Jesus replied: "Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." 

HYMN OF THE MONTH: "Is Your All On The Altar"

This song was written by Elisha A. Hoffman in 1900 and was published in 96 Hymnals.

Elisha A. Hoffman was born in Orwigsburg, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, on May 7th, 1839. His parents, Francis A. and Rebecca A. Hoffman, were Pennsylvania Germans. His father was a minister of the Gospel in the Evangelical Association, and rendered over sixty years of service in preaching the Word.



Elisha was educated in the public schools of Philadelphia, the city of Brotherly Love, and graduated in the scientific course from the Central High School. Afterwards he took up the classics and completed a classical course in Union Seminary of the Evangelical Association. For eleven years he was connected with the Association's publishing house in Cleveland, Ohio.

His musical education was limited. He is not a graduate of any School of Music, but he is a natural musician. All the musical knowledge he has, was gained by personal application. Mr. Hoffman's first impressions of music came from hearing the voice of sacred song in the home. His parents both had sweet voices and sang well. It was their custom, in the hour of family worship, both morning and evening, to sing one or two hymns. At an early age, the children became familiar with these hymns and learned to love them and to feel their hallowing and refining power. Their lives were marvelously influenced by this little service of song in the home. A taste for sacred music was created and developed, and song became as natural a function of the soul as breathing was a function of the body.

Under the power of such an environment, Mr. Hoffman came to consciousness of a princely possession with which God had endowed him — the ability to express his intuitions and conceptions in meter and song. His inner being thrilled with inspirations, longing for expression, he used the power with which God had clothed him in the production of the many songs which bear his name. His first composition was given to the world when he was eighteen years of age. Since then heart, brain and pen have been very prolific in the birth of songs.

Over two thousand of his compositions are in print. He has assisted in the compilation and editing of fifty different song books, some of which have received marked favor and have been issued in large editions. All have accomplished a measure of good and have proved a blessing to the world. Many separate compositions have been translated into the languages of different countries and from these many countries have come letters expressing gratitude to the author for their helpfulness and inspiration.

In the larger number of his musical compositions Mr. Hoffman is the author of both the words and music. When a melody is born in his soul, appropriate words seem to be immediately associated with the melody; or, when a conception in his mind crystallizes into a hymn, usually there is present the suggestion of a melody that will give adequate and fitting expression to the mental conception. There are exceptions, but this is the rule which governs him in his musical writings.

Among his most popular and much used songs are: "What a Wonderful Savior!," "Enough for Me," "Are You Washed in the Blood?," "No Other Friend Like Jesus," "I Must Tell Jesus," "Is Your All on the Altar?," and many others.

Like his dad before him, Mr. Hoffman has been an evangelistic minister of the Gospel for many years, and at present is the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Benton Harbor, Michigan, where he has served for over thirteen years. While his ministry in the churches which he has served has been fruitful, his songs in the good which they have done have constituted a still larger ministry. Through his songs he preached to many thousands who had never heard his voice.

While not working in his study or writing gospel songs and hymns, he could be found ministering with the poor in their homes. The story has been told that while visiting one day, he came to a home which had experienced much sorrow and affliction. He found the mother of the home in the depths of despair. He tried to quote Bible verses that he thought would help to console her, but to no avail. Then he suggested that she could do nothing better than to take all of her sorrow to the Lord Jesus. "You must tell Jesus," he told her. Upon mediating upon these words, a light broke across her face and she cried, "Yes, I must tell Jesus." Mr. Hoffman left immediately with those words still ringing in his ears — I must tell Jesus and went home to pen the song, 'I must tell Jesus all of my trials." Elisha Hoffman died on November 25, 1929 in Chicago, Illinois at the age of 90.

JESUS AND THE ETERNAL WEIGHT OF LOVE

Psalm 22:1 David, the Author *"My God My God Why Has Thou Forsaken Me"* David's Cry Approximately1,000 Years Before JESUS CHRIST

The "New Testament's" mission will launch its audience into a spiritual shift change of a spiritual love into a "spiritual forecast" of divine undertaking and venture the mortal's belief, to experience the plan of being a "citizen of grace" gripping mercies unknown, and thrusting us into a "mental spiritual awakening" of a send-off of Hallelujah's like a symphony in the halls of heaven. Are you "tired" of the process of beginning over and over again? Looking for that release, to just live life without the ups and downs of life's hills? What is it to live in peace?

INSPIRATION: What do you really think of the **"HOLY JESUS CHRIST**?" This is a question that we must ask with a **"child-like simplicity"** and present to his **"FATHER,"** as a prayer to allow us to foresee spiritually the majestic work put into the preparation of his son's death and resurrection. Try to imagine ourselves in this year of 2019 "placed" in a position to give our only "son" up to die for neighbors that hated him, friends that said he was a lunatic, those church goers that said he was a devil after he healed a sick child, and the "whole" neighborhood that watched him grow from a baby, now being beaten for their sins, and the children that played with him, now join parents that once watched him play with children in the subdivision, only now lifting him up to authorities to (come), who shall beat the **(unwavering Christians)** simply because they have seen his showing up, lifting up and out of (troubles), healing through pain and loss of their beloved ones, hearing of his great (showing up) all over the world, keeping his WORD.

<u>SITUATION</u>: David amazingly gave an accurate description of the suffering the Messiah would endure hundreds of years later. 22:1. JESUS also would cry out *"My God, My God why has thou forsaken me?"* JESUS quotes this verse for an urgent appeal to GOD. Matthew 27:46

THE PASSION OF JESUS' LOVE: What are the assets of Love? How do we respond to Love? Could we say Love was the "Master's Theme" on the cross? Are you sure the nails held JESUS on the cross? NO IT WAS LOVE THAT HELD JESUS ON THE CROSS. How do we know JESUS demonstrated a deep and eternal love for his FATHER's humanity? A few things come to mind about JESUS on the cross. What are they:

- Scripture points us to the exact moment of angels witnessing this savagery.
- Matthew 26:53 tells us that the Angels were standing on the precipice of Heaven, awaiting the order from God to deliver His Son. **But that order never came.** Jesus said in <u>Matthew 26:53</u> to His accusers, "Do you think that I cannot appeal to My Father, and He will at once put at "My" disposal more than twelve legions of angels?"

(Inspiration of the Psalms cont'd)

OBSERVATION: LOVE'S LABOR was much more an intrinsic deep **"TRIUMPH,"** it was, and yet is, the distinctive mark of God's citizens that they know the **love** of Christ and the weight of LOVE from the Oracle of Heaven with an open door for his children living under oppressions, moans and persecutions. Shamefully, then and now, some reject the gospel, and remain the separated un-convicted... as the gospel comes to us, it does not find us **loving** God; it does not expect those who choose to wander in a dark and miry state to have much merit for the blood of the cross.

The Weight of LOVE

ENLIGHTMENT: This Psalm teaches the Church Community today that God's concern does not begin on the day we are born and conclude on the day we die. It reaches back to those days before we were born, and reaches ahead along the unending path of eternity. (Psalms 22:9-11) Our only sure help comes from GOD whose concern for us reaches beyond our earthly existence.

HOW CAN ANYONE REJECT SUCH A LOVE?

THE CONCLUDING BEAUTY OF IT ALL: "OUR SAVIOR'S LOVE FOR US KEPT HIM ON THE CROSS!" If he had disposal of more than twelve legions of Angels, now that he is "Heir," just what do we have through him when we suffer! It is a phrase translated as "LORD of Hosts" in the KJV and "LORD Almighty" in the NIV. Examples from the Message include Psalm 24:10 *"Who is this King-Glory? God-of-the-Angel-Armies: he is King-Glory."* and Isaiah 6:3 *"Holy, Holy, Holy is God-of-the-Angel-Armies. His bright glory fills the whole earth."*

THREE KEYS TO THE SEED OF FAITH CAMPAIGN:



HEALTH MINISTRY

When was the last time you checked to see if your immune system is up to date? This August, National Immunization Awareness Month raises awareness and encourages everyone to make sure they are current on the necessary vaccinations for potentially harmful diseases. Many diseases can be easily prevented by administering vaccines, and thus, protecting you from unseen viruses. Take the necessary precautions with a simple call to your doctor, and avoid potential harm while leading a healthy, happy life.


- 1. **Call your doctor** The only way to be absolutely certain about what vaccinations you've received is to gather your medical records. Contact your doctor and request your immunization records to determine whether or not you are up to date.
- 2. **Encourage friends to do the same** Just because you feel healthy doesn't mean you don't need to be vaccinated. Unlike most medicines, which treat or cure diseases, vaccines prevent them. When you check your immunization records, encourage friends to do the same, and you can all make sure you are up to date.
- 3. **Know your family history** A family medical history can reveal the history of disease in your family and help a doctor identify patterns that might be relevant to your own health. This will allow the doctor to be best informed about recommending vaccines for immunization.

We finally have a chickenpox vaccine. Prior to the introduction of the vaccine in 1995, there were around 4 million cases per year in the United States. Ten years after the vaccine was recommended in the US, the CDC reported as much as a 90% drop in chickenpox cases. One dose of the vaccine prevents 95% of moderate disease and 100% of severe disease.

Measles meets its match. In 1958, there were 763,094 cases of measles in the United States. In 2008, there were 64 suspected cases of measles thanks to immunization from vaccines.

Meningitis has nearly been eliminated. Meningitis A is an infection that can cause severe brain damage and is often fatal. The introduction of the Meningitis A vaccine in Africa in 2010 has all but eliminated the disease.



As a side note, in lieu of our meeting in July, Creative Learning hosted a fun filled "Christmas in July" event during which we had the opportunity to make pot holders, pillow cases, lanyards and other interesting crafts. Gifts were awarded to those with the appropriate ticket. There was also a contest for the best homemade chili. What an awesome fellowship!

Another important custom we share is the reading of our covenant which was led by Gerry Wright. With the 'preliminaries' out of the way, it was time to focus on our discussions. This month's panelists included Min. Roslyn Long, Mother Gerald Baker, Sisters' Mary Blackburn and Teresa Rainey and another first-time attendee, Min. Jada Redman, who serves on our ministerial staff and has been a member of our church since March of this year.

Below is a combined summary of the remaining questions and answers as presented by our five panelists:

21. Attendance in the Women's Ministry has dropped. What can be done to encourage more women to attend?

Answer: We must take the initiative to invite women of all ages to join with us. We should look to older women to cheer us on and encourage us. Stay positive and keep your mind on God. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord (Colossians 3). Stay out of the flesh; instead, walk in the spirit. Pray for direction from God. When we invite young or new sisters, allow them to share their concerns so we can understand and guide them. Be mindful that it's hard for some of us to come out of our shell. Take the initiative...invite a sister to come. Be willing to pick her up. Do unto others as you would have them do for you. Some are just waiting to be asked. It begins with the love of God in our hearts. If it's in you, you'll seek other women who love God. Women who love God want to be around other women who love Him. 22. Why are Christian ladies so ready to criticize and judge instead of uplifting each other?

Answer: When we walk in love, it's hard to criticize. Jesus Christ is love. We are followers of Christ once we receive Him into our heart. We should have or develop certain characteristics. Everyone who attends church is not a Christian. Christ must be in us. As Christians, we must continue to read the Word. We can't stay babies. We must be mindful that some judge because of an envious or jealous spirit. The Holy Spirit will convict us when we criticize or judge others. However, the enemy will use us if we don't have on the whole armor. You can repent. God is faithful to restore. John 13:34 says, "A new commandment I give unto you, that you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another." Remember that every day we have a choice between the spiritual nature and the carnal. Pray daily. It's important that we make the choice to walk in the Spirit. Remember also that what you feed the most is how you'll conduct yourself. Therefore, quell sinful behavior. Additional scriptures to reflect on include Romans 8:11 and Romans 7:18.

23. Why when the main message in the Bible is to love one another, we do not always see love exhibited among Christians?

Answer: Ecclesiastes 10:4 and Matthew 18:7 speak about how to avoid offenses. In fact, all of our answers can be found in the Word. 2 Timothy 3:16 says, "all scripture is given for inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness." We are to live by it. We must realize how good God has been to us. Spend time around those who love the Lord; who are full of joy; who are glowing. Satan is the accuser of the brethren. We tend to get off track and take our eyes off God. Pray for one another. Allow yourself to be vulnerable. Take off the mask. Be real. God is the only one who can empower us to love our enemies. Pray and Ask God to order your steps in His Word and hide it in your heart. Your love towards your sister must be unconditional. You are to look at her not through the natural eye but through eyes of love. Instead of judging her, look for the good. God wants us talking about Him, not each other.

24. Everyone's relationship with God is personal. So, what makes Christians judge others by the way they dress or act instead of praying for them to grow by God's grace?

Answer: It's personal. Although some are still infants in Christ, we're still growing. Words do hurt and it's not okay to give "people a piece of your mind." We must pray for those who behave in this manner. Be mindful how you approach another sister. That person may need help but you must stay mindful as to how to do that. It's important to remember that as born-again believers, we're accountable to God for our words and deeds. Be careful to be led by the Spirit. In other words, walk in the Spirit so you will not fulfill the lust of the flesh. Romans 4:10 says, "But why do you judge your brother? Or why do you set at nought your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgement seat of Christ."

25. Why are Christians known by how many things we hate than by our acts of love?

Answer: It's because of our words and actions. It can't be said enough that we must be born again. The Holy Spirit will restrain or constrain you. You must feed your spirit daily. We are to be known by our love. Therefore, we must guard our eyes, ears and tongue. Be mindful of what you watch on TV. Feed your spirit daily. What you feed the most is what will be the strongest. Feed your spirit with the Word. Set your affections on things above. Life is short so spend more time with people who bring out the best in you and not the stress in you. Remember, the enemy is strategic; he knows us. We are in a live battle. (Women's Ministry cont'd)

26. Why do bad things happen to good people?

Answer: Nothing can happen to us that did not happen to our sinless Savior, Jesus Christ. We're not always good or bad. Everything is of the Lord who reigns on the just and the unjust. Romans 8:28: "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to His purpose." Matthew 5:44-45: "But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; that ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for He maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust." Philippians 1:29: "For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake." Psalm 91:4: "He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust: his truth shall be thy shield and buckler." Romans 8:37: "Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us." John 16:33: "I have told you these things so that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take courage; I have overcome the world."

We made every effort to provide as many responses as possible without actually identifying who provided them. The past three months of these discussions were most helpful and much needed. They generated a good amount of follow-up questions from our audience and prayerfully satisfied the 'need to know.'

We are truly grateful for the time and effort put in and pray that God will continue to use each as His voice of truth in addressing the concerns of the body of Christ.




