Obedience in the dictionary can be broken down as simple compliance, dutifulness, respect, discipline, conformity or submissiveness. God's definition of Obedience relates to hearing or hearkening to a higher authority or positioning oneself under someone by submitting to their authority and command.

Because of disobedience, Saul was rejected as king because he failed to utterly destroy the Amalekites, instead he chose to keep the best of the best for himself and to offer sacrifice to God. God did not want Saul's sacrifice, he wanted his obedience.

I Samuel 15:22 NIV – "But Samuel replied: Does the LORD delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the LORD? To obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed is better than the fat of rams." This means we have to hear, trust, submit and surrender to God and his Word.


Reasons for Obedience:

- 1. **Jesus Calls Us to Obedience** John 14:15, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments."
- 2. **Obedience Is an Act of Worship** Our works cannot make us righteous, but because of the Grace the Lord has extended to us, obedience should be flowing from our hearts out of gratitude. Romans 12:1 "I beseech you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service."

- 3. **God Rewards Obedience** Genesis 22:18 "And through your descendants all the nations of the earth will be blessed—all because you have obeyed me."
- 4. **Obedience to God Proves Our Love** 1st and 2nd John shows that obedience to God demonstrates love for God. "By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments" (1 John 5:2–3) and doing what God has commanded us, and he has commanded us to love one another, just as you heard from the beginning (2 John 6).
- 5. **Obedience to God Demonstrates Our Faith** When we obey God, we show our trust and faith in Him: And we can be sure that we know him if we obey his commandments. If someone claims, "I know God," but doesn't obey God's commandments, that person is a liar and is not living in the truth. But those who obey God's word truly show how completely they love him. That is how we know we are living in him. Those who say they live in God should live their lives as Jesus did. (1 John 2:3–6)
- 6. Obedience Is Better Than Sacrifice 1 Samuel 15:22-23, But Samuel replied, "What is more pleasing to the LORD: your burnt offerings and sacrifices or your obedience to his voice? Listen! Obedience is better than sacrifice, and submission is better than offering the fat of rams. Rebellion is as sinful as witchcraft, and stubbornness as bad as worshiping idols. So, because you have rejected the command of the LORD, he has rejected you as king."
- 7. Disobedience Leads to Sin and Death the disobedience of Adam brought sin and death into the world but Christ's perfect obedience restores fellowship with God for everyone who believes in Him. Romans 5:19 "For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous" and I Corinthians 15:22 "For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive."
- 8. **Through Obedience We Experience the Blessings of Holy Living** Jesus was the only perfect one who walked sinless and in perfect obedience. As we spend more time with God through his Word, Fellowship and Worship, the Holy Spirit will transform us from within as we can grow in holiness. Obedience should be a lifestyle for us. 2 Corinthians 7:1 "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God."

Reginald Heber was born in 1783 into a wealthy, educated family. He was a bright youth, translating a Latin classic into English verse by the time he was seven, entering Oxford at 17, and winning two awards for his poetry during his time there. After his graduation he became rector of his father's church in the village of Hodnet, near Shrewsbury in the west of England where he remained for 16 years. He was appointed Bishop of Calcutta in 1823 and worked tirelessly for three years until the weather and travel took its toll on his health and he died of a stroke. Most of his 57 hymns, which include "Holy, Holy," are still in use today. -- Greg Scheer, 1995

INSPIRATIONS FROM THE PSALMS

A Psalm of David to the Chief Musician 19:1-14 (KJV) "The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork." (vs. 1)

A strange fever has plagued mere men in this final stage of "Life" and Salvation through the only "Sovereign Builder of the Universe called "Earth"?! But the true people of GOD know the Divine Shepherd's voice! Not by an outside knowledge of men but by his own confirmation of his galaxies, elements, seas, oceans, heavenly bodies must (simple men) bow. There are many roads in a daily commute, but The Sovereign GOD in his infinity knows your exit and what lies beyond! We all must stay in our own "lanes" when dealing with sensitive worshipping and praising our LORD, and not elevating ourselves above the Eternal's Wisdom according to his "Holy Word," compared by his "Holy Word" breathed from the Holy Source of his own and Holy Self!

Anything other than the Word, from the Word, or confirmed by biblical scripture is a "strange wisdom!" All should go to the "Rock of Salvation", a Holy Guide – Jesus, the Christ and Redeemer sent to earth by God. Avoid the end-time fever of being revered or reverenced as mere fading men! We are but "stewards," servants set apart, redeemed and snatched from error; BUT as the "Legal Script of all Creation" testifies of One Creator, One LORD, One "Divine Holy Spirit" of the Creator Father who gave his Son the "Divine Mantel" to be Revered, Reverenced, Bowed to, to be "Feared" of who he is, what he can do and the "Only" True and Worthy Name above all names to be praised! By Whom? By his own people "knowing the full Truth" through the "Magnificent Messenger," Holy, Throne-based, referred to "GOD's own people by Covenant, Adoption, and by whoever will come by "Repentance," and by the spirit of truth, in whom the inseparable Holy Spirit "testifies" by "One Sovereign and Divine Wisdom of our Creator and Testament." All else is a "strange fire fanned by men."

That old devil, called Lucifer, used his (evil) wisdom to manipulate Eve with a bit of truth that if she ate she would not die but know between good and evil, the strategy, an (evil) outside argument of the AUTHOR of Sovereign Truth. The internet isn't a fool-proof measuring tool on "REASONING," it too is a tool saying what GOD calls a thing to be loathsome, man is calling GOD's WORD wrong to suit sin's appeal. Adam and Eve, like many today, go along with an argumentum set of heresies from something other than the WORD from the WORD. A tradition of the talking snake!

QUESTION: IS THIS THE FEVER SINFUL MAN IS BELIEVING THAT HE CAN JUST SLIP INTO THE "SPIRITUAL MANTEL" GIVEN TO THE DIVINE DEITY OF THE SON? Casting one over another and without discernment? "But we are all as an unclean thing and all our righteousness is as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away" Isaiah 64:6 KJV. David pleads to not become an abomination of GOD. Nor is David "puffed up" for a title; but he bends himself in a lowly prostate position as the sinner he was – outside wisdom apart from the Word, proofed by the Word, from the teachings of the original Apostle who walked with their fisherman of men!

David entered into the "spirit" as he kept his father's flock and wrote this song of Psalm 19 for the worshippers of the sanctuary with a heated, fervent passionate expression recorded to GOD's creating works in a Spiritual-dimension run-down of his "glory" as David relied upon GOD's wisdom in his early days attending the flock! They are: the heavens, seas, earth. David's own mind began to connect and his heart hinged "on his maker's Divinity" in all his creation; and David begins to comply that God's natural bible was his works of creation and hemmed and threaded with "Divine Wisdom." How does David begin to help us today to enter God's natural "divine and universal mental and spiritual" school from the "pastures to king"?! David began to ascend mentally by a spiritual journey scanning the upmost cosmos from the edge of the pastured fields of sheep. He magnified the Excellency of God's clouds, the **peripheral rains and gets ecstatic as he pens the** scene's first page in his mind where the Genus of Genesis begins. David's **"spiritual mantel"** from birth gave him a "spiritual passport" to commune genuinely from a dusty heart! Every seeker of the heart of God should ask the Father Creator to give me the seeds to be "genuine" that I may walk daily with your Holy Spirit to know only your Wisdom and not an evil wisdom of men.

This is spiritual discernment, meaning relating to the soul or spirit of spiritual and sacred things rather than worldly things akin to 1 Corinthians 2:15 "But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man." David begins to trace God's goodness in his current lows and highs at the edge of the sheep pastures, and this is how this Psalm unfolds of a mere man in need and search of his Divine's hands stroking his new found Wisdom: Let us step with David from a small margin of spiritual loneness. Infinity lent her spiritual vision to David and invited him to peek into the "beauty" of her Master's vestige meaning to trace the evidence of the Creator's boundless breadth from the heavenly throne. This is how David pens with a soul of love (Psalm 19:1-6 KJV): "The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork." We, too, are surrounded by God's fantastic displays of His craftsmanship. The heavens give dramatic evidence of his existence, his power, his love and his care. David confirms the world is confirming God's works are to be told in his sanctuary on that great morning like a farmer plowing his field. So, the assembly heightens their voices as the Master's plowmen make plain the WISDOM of God is his word, works and his testimony of how the Heavenly Trinity speaks and the earth, by his words, yielding seeds as food and all his creatures show God's glory and his grace. God's cosmos is his school of divinity, for man receives God's glory to reverence this mercy giver.

OUESTION: WHAT SPIRITUAL GUIDE ARE YOU FOLLOWING? There in the Accepted Book are his scriptures, a Rock unto his sanctuary that is above all teaching and original from his own heart to be abided in and to be abided by his people, and as if day and night are richly pouring fountains of spiritual water upon the earth from his mid-air rains. Let man not glory creation but the one who has created



his Creation. Let us Glory that he, the Creator, may be praised for all his works and the "whole" length of all that is made both under the heavens and in his heavens. The sun, moon and stars are God's (ancient like the antiquity of time), his traveling preachers obeying their commandments to rise all over the world in different timelines; the Creator unprejudiced where his brightness, his evenings, or his benevolence of the morning or noon day may touch the skins of his mankind of all creeds and genders.

They are his ancient apostles upon their journey confirming those who regard the Lord and condemning those who worship idols. The heavens are *declaring* for the continuance of their testimony intended by their employer, being God, every moment God's existence, power, wisdom and goodness are being sounded abroad by the heavenly dispatched Word, as **forerunners**, leaping into their spoken assignments which shine upon us from above. Let those who "tilt not" to wisdoms outside the handy working of their "known Creator shout Hallelujah!" David was a man who could pray, and his Creator's heart would glory at such a prize when man would submit in spirit and his heart becomes poetic through a spiritual "outburst" from his awakening soul!

WHEN NO ONE RESPECTS YOU: David was not respected. **Why?** From birth people can be born with **(special) gifts, and mantles**. They will have God's hands upon them. Usually, they are quiet, loners, set apart. David was very special, unclean morally, but God favored him from the womb; God knew a theme about David. What? He saw a man that would love him with all of his heart, and until his death. We who are God's must truly be innocent of what we are accused of. <u>Proverbs 28:5</u> "Evil men do not understand justice, but those who seek the LORD comprehend fully." Verses 7-11: David prayeth for Grace. The word showeth David's grace of God's truth was that **"The** *Heavens"* are varied in their multiplicity, made up of their constableships amid dripping heavens with their billows of innumerable forms, their routed external spaces react in an upheaval of and within "cosmological heavens" in the company of every part of the glories of God's glories of a maximum wonderful thing of spiritual applause by his excellent elemental systems, ever in a waltz with his brilliant heavens with all the "awes" of long nights of what the Heaven of heavens contain. David could "bestir" the heart of God with his words of exaltation.

Verses 12-14: David begins to understand the contrary effect, and man's natural blindness of a man's soul. It is well again to observe the gradation, the convert becoming a disciple and then a rejoicing soul; he now obtains a discerning eye and as a spiritual man discerned all things, though he himself is discerned of no man. The interlude of Psalm 19 is also a thread to Psalm 18:20 – Wisdom of the blind are those people that think that belief in God is a crutch for weak people who cannot make it on their own. God is indeed a buckler (shield) to protect us when we are too weak to face certain trials by ourselves. By whose authority are you traveling?!

Scripture: Romans 10:15 Sermon Title: "The Preacher's Feet"

A recap of Elder Rainey's message by Mother Gerald C. Baker:

The Pastor is the HEAD, sent to the people, and he is given the vision for the church.

The vision is given to the Pastor--the Head contains the eyes. The Body trusts the Head. The Body has no function but to follow. "I don't see that!" The Head talks to the Body; the Ears are in the Head, so the Body 'hears.' God speaks via the Mouth which is in the Head; the Head talks.

The Pastor holds the office: He leads and feels. The Church follows as the Pastor follows! So, "How beautiful are the Feet!" The Feet support the Body via their mass, measurement and makeup. The Feet hold up the entire Body! The Pastor is always expected to be there, and strong. The weight of Friendship Baptist Church is dependent on one pair of Feet: Pastor's!

The Feet balance the Body. The Pastor is responsible for the Doctrinal direction and destiny of the Church. There should be no contrariness or conflict to the Pastor's Vision, and definitely no 'schisms!' The Pastor's Feet stabilizes the belief and practices of the Church. His Feet steadies the behavior. The Hands are flexible, but the Feet are firm in discipline for everybody, anybody, even your body!

The Pastor's Feet inclusively unites the Body. His decisions and decorum are firm. Too many changes are not trustworthy! Everybody wants something different; therefore, the Pastor must be firm.

The Feet steady the Body; the Feet always contacts the ground; the Pastor can't be above the people, but he must be with the people... he is given to hospitality... he must sit on their level. His Feet stations the base, and he is approachable.

Feet move the Body! Without the "Preacher's Feet," there would be no stimulation to move the Church forward! His Feet stimulates what he says—Feet set the bismark—Feet leave footprints and men are to follow to live, labor and to love. The Feet signal the battle!

The "PREACHER'S FEET" are led by the KING!!

He can warn you about sins, but he cannot make your morals. He can love as a child of God, but he cannot place you in God's family.


Pastor can pray for you, but he cannot make you walk with God. He can teach you about Jesus, but he cannot make Jesus your Lord.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month

A Global Burden

According to the <u>World Health Organization</u>, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women worldwide, claiming the lives of hundreds of thousands of women each year and affecting countries at all levels of modernization.

Good News About Breast Cancer Trends

In recent years, perhaps coinciding with the decline in prescriptive hormone replacement therapy after menopause, we have seen a gradual reduction in female breast cancer incidence rates among women aged 50 and older. Death rates from breast cancer have been declining since about 1990, in part due to better screening and <u>early detection</u>, increased awareness, and continually improving treatment options.

October 12, 2019 Fellowship

Suffice it to say that attendance was low but that did not stop the move of the Holy Spirit whose presence filled the atmosphere with joy, humility and thanksgiving.

Our October assembly opened with the usual format which included prayer by Sis. Geraldine Powell, scripture (Romans 15:2, 4, 5-7) read by Sis. Brenda Graves and "God Can Do Anything" sung by Vashawn Mitchell and played for our hearing and inspiration by Sis. Gerri Wright, who followed with the collective reading of our covenant. This is extremely important as it reminds attendees of the purpose for which we come together. For those who may not know, our purpose is "to come together to get to know one another, to share knowledge, to uplift and encourage one another, to fellowship with and enjoy each other's company and to unite in praising the Lord through all we do."

This month, we didn't have any birthdays, anniversaries or first-time attendees to acknowledge but we did spend some time filling out a survey which will be used to aid in preparing for the year 2020. Once the survey was completed, Sis. Cheryl Alford asked that each sister present take a moment to share her personal "go-to" scripture whenever she needs encouragement or wants to encourage someone else.

Sis. Cheryl led the group in sharing Isaiah 41:10: "fear not for I am with you; be not dismayed for I am your God; I will strengthen you, yea, I will help you; yea, I will uphold you with the right hand of My righteousness." This verse had recently become one of her favorites when she heard it spoken while on the morning prayer line. It was actually being shared to encourage someone else, but it resonated with her and she claimed it as her own. She then asked that each sister share her favorite scripture and why it was so. Since we were few in number, we were able to share with you, our readers, what each of our sisters offered along with a brief comment:

Linda Berry: Jeremiah 29:11 "I know the plans I have for you declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." She mentioned God directed her path to teach kids. She received a counseling degree and also ministered to those who were grieving.

Barbara Johnson: Psalm 100:1-3 "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing. Know ye that the Lord he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves..."

Gerry Powell: Psalm 19:14: "Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer." In her country of birth, Cuba, her grandmother said be careful of all you say, who you say it to and how you say it, as you cannot erase your words.

Evg. Lenn Jones: Psalm 19:14 "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer". It is one of her favorites because it taught her how to be careful of the things that she says and to also have discernment in what she says. We don't always realize that sometimes our words can hurt.

Halynn Brown: Philippians 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." She relies on him for strength, faith and peace. Without those things we cannot go on.

Dorothy Blagmon: Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." We must trust Him daily. She asks Him to guide her in her walk and talk.

Ruth Ellis: Has many favorites, one of which is Psalm 23. She raised her granddaughter and always helps her with problem solving and frequently quotes "The Lord will make a way somehow."

Brenda Graves: 42 years ago gave her life to Christ. Her scripture is Psalm 27:14 "Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart; wait, I say, on the Lord." After her bout with cancer, it took her a year to get back up on her feet. This psalm strengthened her.

Debbie Chambers: Romans 10:13 "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." Believing and having true faith in Him helps us to be better women.

Hazel Franklin: Proverbs 3:5 "Trust in the Lord and lean not unto your own understanding." She cannot lean on her own understanding. She received a bookmark with this verse 25 years ago. Deacon Bailey usually quotes this scripture in his bible study class. She reads and lives by this verse.

Gerry Wright: Psalm 23 "The Lord is MY Shepherd..." He guides her, protects her, nourishes her and promises her goodness and mercy will follow her all the days of her life and she will dwell in the house of the Lord forever. She recites it when she awakes and before she goes to bed as it comforts her.

It was a wonderful opportunity to hear how each woman is guided through her Christian journey with the comfort of the Word of God.

October has been deemed Health Awareness or Breast Cancer Awareness month. While the ministry did not focus on this fact per se, we did invite two of our sisters to share a testimony about recent events in their lives which greatly impacted their faith in our Great and Mighty God as they handled those situations. As a way of introduction, a song was shared that was believed would speak of their gratitude. Our first speaker was Mother Pat Ashe who shared her journey through the cancer diagnosis of her sister-in-law and the sudden death of her brother. The song of praise chosen for her was "Thank You Lord" sung by Walter Hawkins.



She shared that her sister-in-law was diagnosed with bone cancer and given five months to live. Following that, she fell and broke her shoulder. Mother Pat traveled to West Virginia to help her out. While there, she became concerned about her brother's PTSD, although there was no indication that he was sick. However, in June, she received a call that he was going into the hospital for a hernia operation. He went into the hospital on a Wednesday and by the following Saturday, he had passed away. She shared that out of seven siblings, there were only two left. Mother Pat decided to return to West Virginia for a month to spend time with her sister-in-law who was grief stricken over the loss of her best friend (husband). While there, the Holy Spirit spoke to her spirit and told her to let her brother go; he was with the Lord. It was okay to miss him but do not hold on to the pain. Instead, pray for your family and friends who do not know the Lord.

Mother Pat believes that since her brother could not go for the necessary treatments, the Lord took him home at the beginning of his illness. Even though he was an ex-marine and ex-firefighter, he could not stand pain. A few highlights from her testimony included the fact that God changed the atmosphere for her. She began reflecting on the good times she and her brother shared. God changed her understanding about the importance of being saved. She received a joy and a freedom through her experience. One thing became clear: although he departed this life, her brother still lives in her heart. Don't grieve for the dead. Instead, grieve for the lost. Be joyful for those who have a relationship with Him. She concluded her testimony with a quote by the late Billy Graham: "Everything that happens prior to death is a preparation for the final voyage. Death marks the beginning not the end; it's our journey to God." One of the scriptures she shared was Romans 8:28 "all things work together for good to them who love the Lord; who are called according to His purpose."

The second testimony came from Min. Karen Blacknell. Prior to her sharing, we had a musical interlude: "For Every Mountain" by Kurt Carr and the Kurt Carr Singers. Min. Karen began by sharing that in 2013, she got up to go to the bathroom and passed out. She went to the doctor and had some labs done. She was immediately taken to emergency because her kidney was failing. In fact, it was functioning at only seven percent. She objected to taking dialysis until her husband, Rev. Ken Blacknell, returned home from Maryland. Once she agreed, she started PD dialysis and continued every night for nine hours each night. That was 2013.

Fast forward to 2015, she had to have a knee replacement. While recovering in the hospital, she was diagnosed with breast cancer. In her own words, she pulled up the covers over her head and talked to the Lord: "I am on dialysis; I'm diabetic, I've had a knee replacement and NOW CANCER!!! Add to that the fact that there were some complications from the dialysis and she recently spent 10 days in the hospital. She had to have surgery after which she experienced excruciating pain in her abdomen. After a CAT scan was performed, she was told she had to go back into surgery because they had accidentally clipped her intestine and 'stuff' was spilling out.

While recuperating in her bed, an unidentified doctor came in to her room and said: "praise the Lord; you are a miracle." She asked hospital personnel who he was but no one was able to tell her. However, all of the doctors agreed that she was a miracle. Long story short, as of today, she is no longer diabetic; her A1C is 5.7 and she is no longer on insulin or pills. Min. Karen says she continues to pray for total healing and restoration of her kidneys and she holds on to Mark 9:23 "If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth." Without any hesitation, Min. Karen declares: "I believe."

What has been shared is a brief overview of what we heard. The morning events were a true blessing and encouragement to all present. We did not end there. While enjoying a light breakfast, Sis. Hazel Franklin came forward and shared her testimony of how she had lost her job but not her faith. While waiting patiently for the Lord to provide, she continued to fill her days with serving Him through helping out in the Outreach Ministry. Ultimately, our God did not delay. He provided a new position that afforded her a substantial increase in salary. What a mighty God we serve!



Our next meeting will take place on the 2^{nd} Saturday in November. We look forward to seeing you there. Blessings of peace and prosperity to all.

BLACK HISTORY FACTS

Facts 11-20 of 120 Black History Facts:

Fact #11: After African-American performer <u>Josephine Baker</u> expatriated to France, she famously smuggled military intelligence to French allies during World War II. She did this by pinning secrets inside her dress, as well as hiding them in her sheet music.

Fact #12: Scientist and mathematician <u>Benjamin Banneker</u> is credited with helping to design the blueprints for Washington, D.C.

Fact #13: Before he was a renowned artist, <u>Romare Bearden</u> was also a talented baseball player. He was recruited by the Philadelphia Athletics on the pretext that he would agree to pass as white. He turned down the offer, instead choosing to work on his art.

Fact #14: Though he is of Caribbean ancestry and had a trailblazing smash with his 1956 album *Calypso*, <u>Harry Belafonte</u> was actually born in the United States. The internationally renowned entertainment icon and human rights activist is from Harlem, New York.

Fact #15: Musician and activist <u>Harry Belafonte</u> originally devised the idea for "We Are the World," a single that he hoped would help raise money for famine relief in Africa. The song was a huge success, going multi-platinum and bringing in millions of dollars.

Fact #16: Before becoming a professional musician, <u>Chuck Berry</u> studied to be a hairdresser.

Fact #17: <u>Chuck Berry</u>'s famous "duck walk" dance originated in 1956, when Berry attempted to hide wrinkles in his trousers by shaking them out with his now-signature body movements.

Fact #18: The parents of actress <u>Halle Berry</u> chose their daughter's name from Halle's Department Store, a local landmark in her birthplace of Cleveland, Ohio.

Fact #19: In 1938, first lady <u>Eleanor Roosevelt</u> challenged the segregation rules at the Southern Conference on Human Welfare in Birmingham, Alabama, so she could sit next to African-American educator and activist <u>Mary McLeod Bethune</u>. Roosevelt would come to refer to Bethune as "her closest friend in her age group."




