# Obedience

Obedience in the dictionary can be broken down as simple compliance, dutifulness, respect, discipline, conformity or submissiveness. God's definition of Obedience relates to hearing or hearkening to a higher authority or positioning oneself under someone by submitting to their authority and command.

Because of disobedience, Saul was rejected as king because he failed to utterly destroy the Amalekites, instead, he chose to keep the best of the best for himself and to offer sacrifice to God. God did not want his sacrifice; he wanted his obedience.

I Samuel 15:22 - But Samuel replied: "Does the LORD delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the LORD? To obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed is better than the fat of rams. This means we have to hear, trust, submit and surrender to God and his Word.

### **Reasons for Obedience:**

- 1. **Jesus calls us to Obedience** John 14:15, If you love me, you will keep my commandments
- 2. **Obedience is an Act of Worship** Our works cannot make us righteous but because of the Grace the Lord has extended to us, obedience should be flowing from our hearts out of gratitude. Romans 12:1 "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service."
- 3. **God Rewards Obedience** Genesis 22:18, "And through your descendants all the nations of the earth will be blessed—all because you have obeyed me."
- 4. **Obedience to God Proves our Love** 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> John shows that obedience to God demonstrates love for God. "By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments". (1 John 5:2–3) and doing what God has commanded us, and he has commanded us to love one another, just as you heard from the beginning. (2 John 6)
- 5. **Obedience to God demonstrates our Faith** When we obey God, we show our trust and faith in Him: And we can be sure that we know him if we obey his commandments. If someone claims, "I know God," but doesn't obey God's commandments, that person is a liar and is not living in the truth. But those who obey God's word truly show how completely they love him. That is how we know we are living in him. Those who say they live in God should live their lives as Jesus did. (1 John 2:3–6)
- 6. **Obedience is better than sacrifice** 1 Samuel 15:22-23, But Samuel replied, "What is more pleasing to the LORD: your burnt offerings and sacrifices or your obedience to his voice? Listen! Obedience is better than sacrifice, and submission is better than offering the fat of rams. Rebellion is as sinful as witchcraft, and stubbornness as bad as worshiping idols. So because you have rejected the command of the LORD, he has rejected you as king."


### (Obedience cont'd)

- 7. **Disobedience leads to sin and death** the disobedience of Adam brought sin and death into the world but Christ's perfect obedience restores fellowship with God for everyone who believes in Him. Romans 5:19 "For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous"; and I Corinthians 15:22 "For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive."
- 8. **Through Obedience we experience the Blessings of Holy Living** Jesus was the only perfect one who walked sinless and in perfect obedience. As we spend more time with God through his Word, Fellowship and Worship, the Holy Spirit will transform us from within as we can grow in holiness. Obedience should be a lifestyle for us. 2 Corinthians 7:1 "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God."



# **August is National Immunization Awareness Month**

In the U.S., vaccines have greatly reduced or eliminated many infectious diseases that once routinely killed or harmed infants, children, and adults. However, the viruses and bacteria that cause these diseases still exist and you can still get these diseases if you aren't vaccinated.

Every year thousands of adults in the U.S. become seriously ill and are hospitalized because of diseases that vaccines can help prevent. Many adults even die from these diseases. By getting vaccinated, you can help protect yourself from much of this unnecessary suffering.

Even if you received the vaccines you needed as a child, the protection from some vaccines can wear off. You may also be at risk for other diseases due to your job, lifestyle, travel, or health conditions.

**Vaccines can lower your chance of getting certain diseases.** Vaccines work with your body's natural defenses to help you safely develop immunity to disease. This lowers your chances of getting certain diseases and suffering from their complications. For instance:

- Hepatitis B vaccine lowers your risk of liver cancer.
- HPV vaccine lowers your risk of cervical cancer.
- Flu vaccine lowers your risk of flu-related heart attacks or other flu-related complications from existing health conditions like diabetes and chronic lung disease.

### Vaccines lower your chance of spreading disease.

- Some people in your family or community may not be able to get certain vaccines due to their age or health condition. They rely on you to help prevent the spread of disease.
- Infants, older adults, and people with weakened immune systems (like those undergoing cancer treatment) are especially vulnerable to infectious disease. For example, newborn babies are too young to be vaccinated against whooping cough. Unfortunately, whooping cough can be very dangerous or even deadly for them. Pregnant women should get the Tdap vaccine during every pregnancy to help protect their babies from whooping cough. Anyone who is around babies should be up to date with their whooping cough vaccine.

#### You Can't Afford to Get Sick

You have a busy life and too much responsibility to risk getting sick. Vaccines can help you stay healthy so you don't miss work. If you can avoid getting sick, you will have more time for your family, friends and hobbies.

Getting recommended vaccines can give you some peace of mind. You will have the best possible protection available against a number of serious diseases.



Sponsored by the FBC Outreach Ministry





# AUGUST – BLACK HISTORY MOMENTS




August 20, 1619

John Rolfe, Virginia's first tobacco planter & husband of the Indian princess Pocabontas, reports the arrival of the first African American slaves in English North America.

They were brought to Virginia by a Dutch trade ship named the White Lion. In his letter to the Virginia Company of London Rolfe writes:

"brought not any thing but so and old Negrous, web the Governor and Cago Marchant brought for victuals . . . at the best and easyest rate they could."



# W 96 FIRST AFRICANS IN VIRGINIA

The first documented Africans in Virginia arrived here in Aug. 1619 on the White Lion, an English privateer based in the Netherlands. Colonial officials traded food for these "20 and odd" Africans, who had been captured from a Portuguese slave ship. Among present-day Hampton's earliest African residents were Antony and Isabella. Their son, William, was the first child of African ancestry known to have been born in Virginia (ca. 1624). Many of the earliest Africans were held as slaves, but some individuals became free. A legal framework for hereditary, lifelong slavery in Virginia evolved during the 1600s. The United States abolished slavery in 1865.

# Civil Rights Act, 1957

- 1957, Pres. Eisenhower passed the Civil Rights Act to increase African American voting in the South.
- Various 'Jim Crow' laws had limited the ability of blacks to vote without paying a poll tax or passing a <u>literacy test</u>.
- Act created a <u>Civil Rights Commission</u> giving federal courts the power to register African American voters.
- Registration procedures were so complex that the act proved to be ineffective, but it helped set the pattern for later civil rights legislation.





# Civil Rights Act of 1957

- Pres. Eisenhower signs Civil Rights Act of 1957 into law.
- Small victory
- Protected rights of minorities
- But lacked power and conviction



The Marin County Civic Center in San Rafael, California, United States was the target of two related domestic terrorist attacks in 1970, tied to escalating racial tensions in the state's criminal justice system. On August 7, 17-year-old Jonathan P. Jackson attempted to coerce the release of the Soledad Brothers (including his older brother George) by kidnapping Superior Court judge Harold Haley from the Marin County Civic Center in San Rafael, California. The resulting shootout left three men and one boy dead, including both Jackson and Judge Haley. Two others were wounded. The event received intense media coverage, as did the subsequent manhunt and trial of Angela Davis, an ousted professor from UCLA with connections to George and Jonathan Jackson, and the Black Panthers. Davis owned the weapons used in the incident. On October 8 of that year, the Weathermen detonated explosives in support of the earlier incident.




### **National Black Anthem**





Heat exhaustion symptoms include rapid, shallow breathing, cold and clammy skin, heavy perspiration, general weakness, muscle cramps, and possible loss of consciousness. Heat stroke includes deep breaths followed by shallow breathing, fluctuating pulse, dry hot skin, dilated pupils, loss of consciousness/possible coma, and seizures or muscular twitching. Heat stroke could result in brain damage or even death. If you find someone with heat exhaustion or heat stroke, try to cool them down, hydrate them, and call 911.

Follow these tips to stay safe in the summer heat:

- Stay hydrated during outdoor activities by drinking plenty of water
- Take a cool shower, especially after long exposure to the sun
- Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting. A brimmed hat and sunglasses provide protection to the head, face, and eyes
- Use sunscreen and take breaks in shade
- Limit outdoor activities to early morning or late evening.
