National Diabetes Month 2021



November is National Diabetes Month, a time when communities across the country team up to bring attention to diabetes. This year's focus is on prediabetes and preventing diabetes.

Prediabetes is a serious health condition where your blood sugar levels are higher than normal, but not high enough yet to be diagnosed as type 2 diabetes. According to the CDC, more than 1 in 3 U.S. adults have prediabetes—that's 88 million people—but the majority of people don't know they have it.

The good news is that by making small healthy lifestyle changes, it is possible to prevent type 2 diabetes and even reverse your prediabetes.

Here are some tips to help manage prediabetes and prevent diabetes.

- **Take small steps.** Making changes to your lifestyle and daily habits can be hard, but you don't have to change everything at once. It is okay to start small. Remember that setbacks are normal and do not mean you have failed—the key is to get back on track as soon as you can.
- **Move more.** Limit time spent sitting and try to get at least 30 minutes of physical activity, 5 days a week. Start slowly by breaking it up throughout the day.
- **Choose healthier foods and drinks most of the time.** Pick foods that are high in fiber and low in fat and sugar. Build a plate that includes a balance of vegetables, protein, and carbohydrates. Drink water instead of sweetened drinks.
- Lose weight, track it, and keep it off. You may be able to prevent or delay diabetes by losing 5 to 7 percent of your starting weight.
- **Seek support.** It is possible to reverse prediabetes. Making a plan, tracking your progress, and getting support from your health care professional and loved ones can help you make the necessary lifestyle changes.
- **Stay up to date on vaccinations.** The COVID-19 (booster shot, if eligible) and flu vaccines are especially important for people who may be more likely to get very sick from COVID-19 or the flu, such as people with diabetes.

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VETERANS DAY | NOVEMBER 11

Veterans Day is a time for us to pay our respects to those who have served. For one day, we stand united in respect for you, our veterans. This holiday started as a day to reflect upon the heroism of those who died in our country's service and was originally called <u>Armistice Day</u>. It fell on November 11 because that is the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. However, in 1954, the holiday was changed to "Veterans Day" in order to account for all veterans in <u>all wars</u>.

When first celebrated as Armistice Day, the day marked the end of World War I, formally recognized on the "11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month" in 1918. Today we continue to celebrate the day as Veterans Day, still recognizing the original tie with November 11. That means Veterans Day is on the same day every year -- November 11 -- regardless of on which day of the week it falls. When the date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, government officials or businesses may recognize it on both the official day and the following Monday.

With our hearts filled with gratitude and eyes filled with tears, we thank all you brave men and women who sacrificed so much, so that we could have a better life and a country to call home. Thank you so much. Happy Veteran's day.

What Does it Really Mean to "Give Thanks in All Things...in Everything"?

Thankfulness is a complicated state of being. When life is good, and someone is getting what they want, it is easy to achieve. When life is hard, and nothing goes right, it is hard to have a spirit of gratitude. In fact, for many people, difficult times or circumstances are the easiest excuse to justify ingratitude.

The Bible has much to say about being thankful, and its message runs counter to the instincts of man. In his letter to the church at

Thessalonica, the Apostle Paul wrote, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

Despite this seemingly difficult task for people, the Bible is full of hope, of God's unshakable promises, and the sufficient reasons needed in order to give thanks in all things.

What Does It Mean to "Give Thanks in All Circumstances...In All Things"?

As difficulties pile on, it can be easy to look around and see nothing good, sinking into despair, perpetual anger, and an inability to feel gratitude. The Bible does not pretend there is no suffering, with the Book of Ecclesiastes acknowledged there will be, "a time to kill ... a time to break down ... a time to weep ... a time to mourn" (Ecclesiastes 3:3-4).

In order to be thankful at all times it is important to have sources of joy, something to always be grateful for, and reminders to turn to those sources of joy and good things when times are hard.

What should be the Christian's ultimate source of joy? To get through loss, suffering, and chaotic times, it would need to be something permanent and unchanging. Jesus prayed to His Father, "But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves" (John 17:13). He wants those who love Him to have His joy, and to be thankful for those things which bring joy.

Jesus had joy when:

- A sinner repented and became saved: Luke 15
- When the Father's will is done: Luke 10:20-24
- When thinking about eternity together John 16:20-22

The Bible also encourages believers to be thankful for:

- Jesus' everlasting words: John 17:3
- God's unchanging nature: Psalm 102:27
- Salvation through Jesus' death and resurrection: 1 Corinthians 15:57
- The eternal home in Heaven: Hebrews 12:28

(Give Thanks in All Things cont'd)

Ultimately, the Bible encourages believers to focus on eternal things. It is important to thank God for earthly blessings, but in order to always be thankful, there must be things to thank God for that do not rust, decay, or disappear. The way to always give thanks is to remember to thank God for His eternal gifts and promises.

When the Bible says to give thanks in all things, it asks people to thank God for blessings both visible and invisible. When He blesses, thank Him, and thank Him for the things unseen in which Christians place their hope.

Of course, the verse does not mean that every second of everyday Christians should be muttering "thank you God" under their breath. Instead, it encourages an attitude adjustment and a re-focusing of priorities. Thanking God for blessings through praise and prayer is the first step, and the second is by turning away from earthly wants and desires, and focusing on the future promises that will matter forever, that are guaranteed by the Word of God, so there is always something to thank Him for, even if current circumstances are difficult.







From the October 31st lesson "Praise God with Music" Psalms 149:1-5; 150:1-6¹ "Praise ye the LORD. Protect your pipes this Thanksgiving. Butter, cheese, milk, ice cream, and oils are all great additions to your favorite recipes, but they're not great additions to our county's sewer system or to your septic tank. These foods are all examples of fats, oils, and grease, or FOG, which can potentially clog pipes when not disposed of properly. FOG can solidify after being rinsed down the sink, creating blockages that can cause messy and costly sewage backups in your home. When grease is washed down the drain, it may seem like a small amount, but as many people can sadly attest, it adds up, and when it does, it can create blockages. Kitchen byproducts also pose a risk to our natural resources by polluting our community's creeks and streams if the backup causes overflows in the public sewer system.

When cooking, you can keep pipes clear of FOG by pouring cooled grease into a container with a top so it can be recycled or placed in a trash can for disposal. You should also wipe cookware and dishes with paper towels and place solid scraps in the trash.

Toilet rebate program can save water and money. The Department of Water Resources participates in a toilet rebate program that can give you up to \$150 in rebates for new, WaterSense 1.1gpf labeled toilets. To qualify, your home must have been built before 1993. Only two toilets can be rebated. Details on how to apply can be found on the <u>Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District website</u>. 
PUBLIC SAFETY

Be careful when deep frying turkeys. If you're planning to deep-fry the holiday bird, remember to follow proper precautions to prevent a fire or burn injury:

- Use a fresh or thawed bird when cooking in a turkey fryer; placing a frozen turkey into a fryer could cause a violent reaction
- Lower the turkey into the pot slowly the hot oil may bubble fiercely at first; allow the bubbles to settle before lowering the bird the rest of the way
- Always use turkey fryers outdoors and a safe distance from the house or any other combustible material; never leave the fryer unattended
- Place the turkey fryer on a solid, flat, and level surface, and never use the turkey fryer on the back deck or in the garage/carport
- To avoid a spillover of hot oil, do not overfill the fryer
- Keep children and pets away from the fryer; the pot will be extremely hot both during and immediately after cooking, so remember to use insulated cooking mitts or potholders when touching the pot or removing the lid cover
- Keep the oil temperature in the turkey fryer at the recommended level (350°F or below) when cooking; the oil could ignite and burn if the temperature is raised above the recommended level
- The oil in the pot should be completely cooled before removing or storing
