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

VICTORY

Many of God's children are living defeated, unsatisfying and unsatisfactory lives. They have never entered into the experience of the peaceful life (Isaiah 30:15); the overflowing life (John 7:37-39); the abundant life (John 10:10); the joyful life (John 15:11); the liberated life (Romans 6:7); the triumphant life (2 Corinthians 2:14); and the loving life (1 John 2:5) – and yet they long to do so!

- **1. What is meant by a life of victory?** Seven characteristics of such a life are mentioned above, and many other scriptures could be cited. Consider the following:
 - (1) It is not a life in which it is impossible to sin, but a life in which victory over sin is possible. The first is unobtainable in this life, but the second is attainable.
 - (2) It is not an abnormal life or a life to be enjoyed by just a few of God's children, but it is His provision for every Christian.
 - (3) It is not a life where there is no temptation, but a life where temptation is overcome—Hebrews 4:15.
 - (4) It is not a life of outward victory only, but a life of inward and outward victory.
 - (5) It is not a fully grown life where further growth in grace is unnecessary or impossible.

The victorious life is a life of victory over SIN, SELF, and SATAN; a life of freedom from the power of sin as well as freedom from the penalty of sin; a life that is not only "reconciled to God by the death of His Son", but a life that is also "saved through His life" (Romans 5:10).

- 2. Is such a life really possible? Is it God's will that we should live such a life of victory? Has He made provision for each and all of His children to be victorious all along the line? If so, we sin against Him by accepting and being satisfied with anything less than His will. If it is not His will it would be a sin against Him to seek or to expect to live this life. Reverse the question for a moment: Is it God's will that we, His children, should live defeated lives? Is it necessary for us to be beset and overcome by such things as temper, touchiness, untruthfulness, pride? Let the following scriptures (and those already mentioned earlier) supply the answer: Matthew 1:21; John 8:34-36; Romans 6-8, which are summed up in Romans 6:14; Philippians 4:13; 1 Thessalonians 4:3; 2 Timothy 4:18; Hebrews 7:25; 1 John 1:7 and 9 and 2:1. These scriptures make it abundantly clear that God desires all His children to experience a victorious Christian life.
- **3.** What is the secret of this life of victory? The secret is a four-fold one, and for the sake of simplicity and clarity it may be stated thus:
 - (1) **Victory is not gained by human effort.** We shall be on the way to living a life of victory when we have truly learned this simple lesson. It is absolutely impossible to live this life in our own strength (read 1 Samuel 2:9). Here is the reason for all our failure; we have tried to gain the victory over sin, self and Satan in our own strength, and we have failed every time? Remember

this: God has excluded the work of man from every tense of salvation. We are not saved from the guilt and penalty of sin by our own works (Ephesians 2:8-10; Titus 3:5); we are not saved from the power of sin by our own (John 14:3). You can see this illustrated in Exodus 14:13-14.

- (2) **Victory is given it is a gift!** 1 Corinthians 15:57 makes this clear. The victorious Christian life is God's gift, and it is offered to everyone who will receive this gift. Indeed, the victorious life which He offers to all men is the victorious, triumphant life of His Son. The Lord Jesus in a human body triumphed gloriously in His life and by His death over sin and Satan; and now His victorious life may be reproduced in and lived out through our human bodies. There is only once victorious life, and when you received the Lord Jesus (John 1:12), you received that life. Did you realize that? Now you must let Him live His life in you and through you see Joshua 6:16 the victory over Jericho was not gained by effort and striving, but by simple trust and obedience. That victory was a gift?
- (3) **Victory is gained by a choice.** It is vital to see this. As long as we are in this world we shall be faced with a choice, as Joshua faced the Children of Israel with a choice (Joshua 24:15). This choice involves a definite, conscious act of the will. Every time we are tempted to sin, if we are to experience victory, we must deliberately choose to please our Lord Jesus Christ who has already gained the victory for us, and who is waiting to give the victory to us and the moment we choose Him we receive His power and enabling (Romans 6:13).
- (4) **Victory is maintained by an attitude**. Victory is only victory, of course, as victory is maintained. What then is the secret of continuous victory? Here it is in a sentence:

"LET US FIX OUR EYES ON JESUS... WHO GIVETH US THE VICTORY..."

And the scriptural warrant for this is found in Hebrews 12:2 (our part) and 1 Corinthians 15:17 (His part).

Ioshua 14:10-12

¹⁰ And now, behold, the LORD hath kept me alive, as he said, these forty and five years, even since the LORD spake this word unto Moses, while the children of Israel wandered in the wilderness: and now, lo, I am this day fourscore and five years old. ¹¹ As yet I am as strong this day as I was in the day that Moses sent me: as my strength was then, even so is my strength now, for war, both to go out, and to come in. ¹² Now therefore give me this mountain, whereof the LORD spake in that day; for thou heardest in that day how the Anakims were there, and that the cities were great and fenced: if so be the LORD will be with me, then I shall be able to drive them out, as the LORD said.

"Who would have thought we'd have to fear so many actions, and yet know that faith and the LORD are on our side?!"

This year, 2021, is not the last mountain we'll have to climb. There will be mountains of debt, precious lost moments, distress, accumulated despair and grief that keep trying to enter our hearts and minds. GOD's people are resilient, and mountains are no contest for the faithful. Question: Do we have mountainclimbing spirits? As we enter this new year, take time to celebrate and reflect on the goodness of GOD. 'We've come this far by faith, leaning and depending on the LORD.'

Mountain climbing involves aspects that force us to rethink our strategies. Caleb is a case study in mountain climbing. He said "let us go up at once and possess the mountain, for we're well equipped to do so"... "A piece of cake," "impossible?"

Ten naysayers were present also! Numbers 3:32. Their false reports were evil! They left God out of the equation. When we include GOD, all things are possible! Let us look into a few lessons in this passage of Scripture:

1. OUR FEAR WAS IRRATIONAL (FOOLISH)

Fear can make us forget every good thing GOD has already done. It can cause retreat. The negative ten scouts were so convincing that the Israelites wanted to settle in the wilderness–no food, nor water. GOD wanted them to move on, but fear held them back.

Every good thing comes from the LORD. <u>Lesson</u>: *You can't mark time, or you'll miss your blessing.* We're in a wilderness of our own and it's called COVID. Our way out is called VACCINE. Don't let fear cause us to miss our blessing.

Is your GOD bigger than any giant you face?! Have FAITH over FEAR. We're fed, healed, provided for, able to take care of our children. We're kept in the midst of it all, able to handle our bills, and we are protected.

(Give Me This Mountain cont'd)

If you haven't had COVID yet, the LORD has protected us! AMEN! We've had comfort, hope. He kept us from falling. Truly provided a ram in the bush, lifted our burdens and healed our bodies. Our fear is irrational and foolish. We've not been given a spirit of fear.

2. YOU CAN'T CONTROL WHAT YOU WON'T CONFRONT

We're discovering that we can make changes through our faith. To admit reality is no sin. It's all in how we see problems. Ten doubted. Caleb and Joshua believed that the LORD was with them. REAL FAITH FEEDS ON THE STUFF THE ENEMY THROWS AT US.

The LORD is with us! It's one thing to proclaim and another to trust that GOD will do it. Go on a quiet vacation getaway and believe. Our dangerous places will be turned into safe havens.

3. WE LEARN THAT GOD BLESSES FAITHFULNESS

Be faithful, love one another, give GOD glory and praise for all He does. Hold onto mountain climbing faith!

How can we be sure of the unflinching mountain climbing? Caleb lived well into his eighties! He asked to lead an army into the Promised Land. 'Give me a mountain at 85—same strength he had at 45 years old, same courage. The LORD had blessed him because he was faithful! He never forgot that GOD had promised him that mountain, and he asked to lead a campaign to take the mountain. GOD reverses every negative situation. Now, the Israelites are the 'giants.'

Be faithful over a few things. GOD is a promise keeper! GOD keeps His word! Sometimes, we have to out wait the naysayers, pray for those who say it can't be done.

Our fear factor was high earlier this year; this new year, we ought to be stronger in our faith. GOD outdid Satan on every hand. GOD blesses the faithful. He will take care of you. He'll make our enemy our footstools.

Try JESUS for yourselves. Trust the LORD to give you the mountain—give you the strength to climb it and to overcome the obstacles.

As you climb, keep your hand in the LORD's Hand. He will see you through.

It's been a rough year, but it's time to celebrate in spite of all the obstacles. Doubt entered the situation, but yet in all of this, GOD is still good. He gives us the strength to keep going. There are going to be some mountains in this new year, but GOD is able!

Be faithful, pray, study the Word, walk in obedience to the Word. Try not to let fear over rule us. Be faithful! Reassess your thoughts about going to church. Let Him direct your path.



Who Can Donate?

In most states, you must be 17 or older to donate whole blood. In states where 16-year-olds are eligible to donate, we require a signed parental consent form.



You must weigh at least 110 lbs. and be in good health—that means you feel well and can perform normal activities. If you have a chronic condition such as diabetes and you want to donate blood, it's important that you are

being treated and the condition is under control. If you're not feeling well on the day of your donation, please contact us to reschedule.

Additional eligibility criteria apply, including certain medications, medical conditions, travel to certain countries, and personal history. You can browse the most common reasons people may not be able to give blood, or view our complete eligibility requirements.

Why Should I Do It?

Whole blood is the most flexible type of donation. It can be transfused in its original form, or used to help multiple people when separated into its specific components of red cells, plasma and platelets. Every day, whole blood donations help save the lives of children and adults fighting to survive cancer, blood disorders, traumatic injuries and more.

The actual donation can be very quick, but you should plan on being at the center for about an hour. You can donate whole blood as often as every 56 days up to 6 times a year.

WHAT CAN WE DO Educate ourselves about the COVID-19 vaccine and get vaccinated.





Stewardship - Part One

It is important for us to know the standard for being good stewards of the Lord's work. That Standard is to be found only in the "Holy Bible" – God's Word.

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be

complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16-17 NKJV)

A steward is a <u>manager</u> or administrator. He takes care of other people's property, and is rewarded or punished for how well he does his job. Jesus used the idea of stewards in his parables (e.g., Luke 12:42, 16:3). Believers are stewards in that God has entrusted to them various resources, and He expects them to use them properly. To do so requires discipline. It's easy to squander what God has given, or to think that the things God gives are really one's own. But believers don't own anything. They are just taking care of or managing God's property (Matthew 25:21, Luke 16:10, 1 Corinthians 4:2, Colossians 4:17).

Biblical stewardship, also known as "Christian stewardship," is the practice of *selflessly* managing everything we have—our talents, time, money, relationships, health, etc.—for God's glory. It's been practiced for thousands of years, and its origins are captured in the many Bible verses about stewardship of money, time, and possessions.

Stewardship Principles in the Bible

- 1. Everything was created by GOD Genesis 1:1, Colossians 1:16-17
- 2. Everything belongs to the LORD Psalm 24:1, Psalm 89:11, Job 41:11b
- 3. GOD has called everyone to be good stewards Genesis 2:15, 1 Peter 4:10
- 4. Christian stewardship can result in growth Genesis 1:28a, 2 Corinthians 9:6
- 5. We will be held accountable for our stewardship Matthew 25:29, 25:23, 27-30
- 6. God will reward good stewardship Colossians 3:23-24, Matthew 6:33, Phil 4:19

Biblical stewardship involves every area of our lives (Romans 12:3-8 and Ephesians 5:15-16).

A biblical understanding of stewardship rests on the foundation that God is the Creator and Owner of all things: "The earth is the LORD'S and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it" (Psalm 24:1). Persons do not truly own anything--even themselves--but hold their time, talents, material resources, the created world, and "God's mysteries" (1 Corinthians 4: 1) in trust to be used for God's purposes.

Within this understanding, we cannot truly give anything to God--all that we have and all that we are is a gift from God. We can, however, return to God a portion of that which is God's (1 Chronicles 29: 14). We offer this portion not out of a sense of duty but as a response to the gracious love of God. As Christians, we have seen God's love most clearly demonstrated in the life, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Christ. In Jesus we see the model of stewardship to which God calls each of us.

(Stewardship cont'd)

Stewardship is a Way of Life

Stewardship is not a particular activity such as serving on a committee or making a financial pledge. Rather, stewardship is a way of life that requires us to put God first in all things, trust God to meet our

needs, and be accountable to God in the way that we use all of the resources entrusted to our keeping. If we use these resources as God intends, the earth and all who dwell in it will be cared for.

A look at several Greek words used in the New Testament and their meanings in English will help us to clarify this holistic understanding of stewardship. *Oikos* (oy' kos) means home or household. *Oikonomos* (oy ko no' mos) is the household manager or administrator; the steward. *Oikonomia* (oy ko no mee' ah) signifies the management or administration of a household stewardship. *Oikoumene* (oy kou me' nay) means the whole world-God's entire household.

The English words *ecology*, *economy*, and *ecumenical* have their roots in these Greek words. These words help us to see that stewardship encompasses the ideas of caring for all of creation, economic management, and the inclusiveness of the entire world within the family or household of God.

Jesus and Stewardship

In addition to words related to stewardship, we can learn from Jesus' parables about how to live as stewards. In the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30), Jesus depicts three servants who were each entrusted with money (talents) as their master left on a long journey. Jesus' listeners would have identified these men as stewards since the responsibility of administering the affairs of a wealthy biblical household was assigned to trustworthy servants.

In Luke 11:5-13 Jesus teaches us that God will provide us with the resources we need. God's generosity is also evident in the Parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard (Matthew 20:1-15). Our generosity, willingness to take risks, and compassion for others is seen in the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). The Parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:1-9), and the parable explained (Matthew 13:18-23) show that we are stewards of God's word as we respond to it in our own lives.

Jesus not only taught us about stewardship but lived as the chief steward. He reached out to persons on the fringes of society-the poor, the sick, the woman, the outcast-to care for all members of the household of God. He used the gifts that God entrusted to him to teach, preach, and heal. He pointed others to the kingdom of God as a trustworthy steward of God's mysteries.

Stewardship of Our Gifts

A **spiritual gift** is a God-given ability for service. Since God will ask Christians to give an account of the stewardship of their gifts, it is important that we know some basic truths concerning spiritual gifts and also know how to discover our own. To get an understanding of Spiritual Gifts, read Romans 12, 12 Corinthians 12, Ephesians 4, and 1 Peter 4.

Discovering Our Spiritual Gifts

1 Peter 4:10 (NIV) "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." We all may have one or more of these gifts:

- Apostleship Administration Distinguishing/Discerning Spirits Prophecy Exhortation
- Miracles Evangelism Faith Healings Pastor Giving Teaching Tongues
- Showing Mercy Interpretation of Tongues Helps

Stewardship of Our Togetherness

Unity and Diversity in One Body

1 Corinthians 12:12 (NKJV) For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ.

The Church as a Body

1 Corinthians 12:12-27:

- The Apostle Paul compares the church to a human body. Both have many parts, but in order to remain healthy they have to function in unison (v. 12).
- The church like the human body is made up of many parts, all diverse (v. 13).
- The human body is made up of many different parts, yet all are important (vv. 14-19).
- In the human body, every individual part is dependent upon the other parts of the body (vv. 20-27).

Caring for One Another

As good stewards of our relationships, we are commanded to care for each other. That care is expressed what are known as the "one another" passages in the New Testament—passages that speak of our care for one another:

- Acts 2:42-45 "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers. And fear came upon every soul: and many wonders and signs were done by the apostles. And all that believed were together, and had all things common; and sold their possessions and goods, and parted them to all men, as every man had need."
- Matthew 5:43-48 "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbor, and hate thine enemy. For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? Do not even the publicans the same? And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? Do not even the publicans so? Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect."
- Galatians 5:13 "For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another."

CALVARY: THE GREATEST GIFT OF ALL TIMES

During this holiday season, a time when most of Christendom is preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, there are many who would find the words that He spoke from the Cross at Golgotha inappropriate, mistimed, and misplaced. But Christmas really is about what eventually would happen 33 years later at that place we reverently know as

Calvary. It is on that "hill far away" that Jesus spoke these words: "When he had received the drink, Jesus said, 'It is finished.' With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit." (John 19:30)

The Master's journey had begun in a stable, a simple manger, in Nazareth, the City of David, 30 some years before. The Angels, Shepherds and Wise Men that were in attendance made certain that the world knew that He was that special gift which had been prophesized. But now the Master was making the pronouncement that "IT IS FINISHED!" As we begin to celebrate this holiday season, we must understand the mission of Christ that was now finished and why Christmas and Easter are forever inextricable and form that most perfect and holy union.

The triune God consented to Jesus coming to carry out, as the Bible says, the following as He defined His mission and how His apostles and we, as His followers, should understand it. Jesus was commissioned to "preach the Gospel to the poor" (Luke 4:18, 43), "to bring life" (John 10:10b), "to destroy the devil's work" (1 John 3:8b), "to bring fire upon the earth," (Luke 12:49), and "to testify to the truth" (John 18:37). Christ's ultimate purpose was to save us from our sins. As Mark wrote, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to **save** what was lost." (Luke 19:10) **What a gift!**


Most Christians love the beauty and splendor of Christmas, all the pageantry and festiveness, but Jesus had a very clear view of what lay ahead of Him during His ministry. He consistently used two metaphors: "To drink the cup," to partake fully of an event, and "to be baptized," to be immersed fully in the event. "Can you **drink the cup** I drink or **be baptized** with the baptism I am baptized with?" (Mark 10:38)

While the Bible is silent to the Master's knowledge of purpose during the silent years of His life, the Christian must accept that Jesus knew what was going to be required to redeem the people of the world. As Luke reminds us, He forebodes His suffering in words such as, "But I have a **baptism** to undergo, and how distressed I am until it is completed! (Luke 12:50)

The cross, in all its sorrow, pain and intensity, is one of the great gifts given to mankind because of its symbolic redemptive power to bear the sins of the world. This gift hung heavily on Jesus during His last days in the flesh. He struggled to a climatic realization in the Garden of Gethsemane and surrendered ultimately to the Father's will. As a gift to mankind, the cup had to be drunk, and the baptism completed. It is finished!

During this Christmas season and the start of a new year, we should all be overjoyed because **It Was Truly Finished at Calvary**. Jesus did what no one else could for mankind. He gave us the greatest gift of all time!

As we unwrapped-gifts that had been carefully placed under our Christmas trees and around fireplaces, let us rejoice because there is no greater gift. God, through Jesus Christ and this sacrifice, made redemption and eternal life available for all of mankind.




DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. ANNUAL CELEBRATION

JANUARY 17, 2022

The idea of Martin Luther King Jr. Day as a holiday was promoted by labor unions in contract negotiations. After King's death, U.S. Representative John Conyers (a Democrat from Michigan) and U.S. Senator Edward Brooke (a Republican from Massachusetts) introduced a bill in Congress to make King's birthday a national holiday. The bill first came to a vote in the U.S. House of Representatives in 1979. However, it fell five votes short of the number needed for passage. Two of the main arguments mentioned by opponents were that a paid holiday for federal employees would be too expensive and that a holiday to honor a private citizen would be contrary to longstanding tradition (King had never held public office). Only two other figures have national holidays in the U.S. honoring them: George Washington and Christopher Columbus.

Soon after, the King Center turned to support from the corporate community and the general public. The success of this strategy was cemented when musician Stevie Wonder released the single "Happy Birthday" to popularize the campaign in 1980 and hosted the Rally for Peace Press Conference in 1981. Six million signatures were collected for a petition to Congress to pass the law, termed by a 2006 article in The Nation as "the largest petition in favor of an issue in U.S. history".




Senators Jesse Helms and John Porter East (both North Carolina Republicans) led the opposition to the holiday and questioned whether King was important enough to receive such an honor. Helms criticized King's opposition to the Vietnam War and accused him of espousing "action-oriented Marxism". Helms led a filibuster against the bill and on October 3, 1983, submitted a 300-page document to the Senate alleging that King had associations with communists. Democratic New York Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan declared the document a "packet of filth", threw it on the Senate floor and stomped on it.





President Ronald Reagan originally opposed the holiday, citing cost concerns. When asked to comment on Helms' accusations that King was a communist, the president said, "We'll know in thirty-five years, won't we?", referring to the eventual release of FBI surveillance tapes that had previously been sealed. But on November 2, 1983, Reagan signed a bill into law, proposed by Representative Katie Hall of Indiana, to create a federal holiday honoring King. The final vote in the House of Representatives on August 2, 1983, was 338-90 (242-4 in the House Democratic Caucus and 89–77 in the House Republican Conference) with 5 members voting present or abstaining, while the final vote in the Senate on October 19, 1983, was 78-22 (41-4 in the Senate Democratic Caucus and 37–18 in the Senate Republican Conference), both veto-proof margins. The holiday was observed for the first time on January 20, 1986. It is observed on the third Monday of January.
















Do you know that you, yes you, young and old, are called to pray?


