WHAT IS GODLY LOVE?

The world says love is about how someone makes them feel or how they feel about someone else, but God says love is about how you behave and treat others and in order for the Church to build unity among the saints, keep friendships, marriages and families together, and show an accurate example of Christ to the world, we need to know what godly love is.

Christian Misconceptions About Godly Love

Misconception 1: We can't love like Christ. His love is just something to aspire to, not something you can actually reach. This is false. The Bible says, "We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us" (Philippians 4:13), for God called us to be conformed to the image of Christ (Romans 8:29) and to love one another like he loved us (John 15:12). These comments usually come from people who don't want to obey God, listen to the lies of the devil, or have failed to love because they tried in their own strength. Loving like Jesus is possible because Jesus commanded us to do so.

Misconception 2: You have to first love yourself before you can love others. We hear this often, but when you look at Scripture it's not there. The truth is: most people love themselves already. By nature, we're self-centered beings. In Mark 12:30-31, Jesus said to love God first. If you love God first, you'll be filled with his love in return so you won't have a problem loving your neighbor as it goes on to command (John 14:23; Ephesians 3:14-21). To love yourself first is contrary to the word of God, self-centered, and not an attribute of love as we see in 1 Corinthians 13:5. If a person doesn't love themselves, it's because they don't love God. Loving God rids a person of self-love issues.

LOVE DEFINED

The world defines love this way: A deep, tender, ineffable **feeling** of affection and solicitude toward another person. An intense **emotional** attachment or **feeling** for a person, place, or thing. A **feeling** of intense **desire** and **attraction** toward a person with whom one is disposed to make a pair.

God defines what love is in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 saying: "Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely. Love does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

After comparing the world's view of love with the Bible's, we get a few things:

- Love is not a feeling.
- Love is not an emotion.
- Love is not attraction.
- Love is not having sex.
- Love is not liking someone.
- Love is not giving gifts.

•

Love is godly moral character.

Notice how the world's definition is based on how they feel about someone—this has nothing to do with love at all. Godly love is all about moral character—how we act and treat other human beings. And we as children of God know that our moral character comes from God (for God is love as seen in 1 John 4:7).

The world says love is about how someone makes them feel, God says love is about how you behave and treat others.

This means that times will come when we don't feel like showing respect, patience, trust, and honesty; but we must push past those feelings and show it anyway. Love is what we do according to the standard of God, not what we feel. The "5 Love Languages" is not love.

Gary Chapman wrote a popular and excellent book called <u>The 5 Love Languages</u>. In it, he describes the five different things people in relationships can do to make the other feel loved. The book helps you learn your mate's love language so you can speak it and have a successful marriage. The languages are:

- 1. Words of Affirmation
- 2. Quality Time
- 3. Receiving Gifts
- 4. Acts of Service
- 5. Physical Touch

As a psychologist, Chapman discovered 5 different actions humans receive that make them feel good; this is not love. These are good things to express to people but not without the foundation of God's love.

How to determine if it's godly love.

(Love cont'd)

A man or woman can know if the person who desires them loves them by lining up that person's character with God's definition of love. They should ask themselves this question: does this person display the attributes of Christ? Through discernment from the Holy Spirit, oftentimes, they will find that this is not the case.

Most people cannot love because love is God (1 John 4:7) who only embodies the born again believer. Without God, no man can love. However, the people of God love like God because they have God in them (John 14:23).

So, where does attraction, desire and passion fit in? Are these love? No. These are simply the natural feelings that come about between the opposite sexes for the purpose of unification, pleasure, and procreation which should only be expressed and enjoyed when a strong foundation of godly love has been established within marital commitment.

God's definition of love is solid—something we can build a foundation on. The world doesn't have a standard. And mainstream Christianity doesn't follow God's standard either. This is why love is so confusing and disastrous in this world—it's not love all.

Of course, people want God's kind of love, but it's hard to find on earth because it comes from above. Until people come to God and interact with his children, they will never experience godly love.


1 Corinthians 13:4-7 names 13-16 different attributes (depending on what Bible version you use):

- 1. Love is **Patient**.
- 2. Love is **Kind**.
- 3. Love is **Happy** for others rather than envious.
- 4. Love is **Humble** rather than boastful, disrespectful, proud and arrogant.
- 5. Love is **Forgiving** and doesn't keep a record of wrongs.
- 6. Love is **Honest** and doesn't rejoice in evil.
- 7. Love is **Covering** the faults of others, rather than gossiping about them.
- 8. Love is **Hopes for the best** for people rather than the worst.
- 9. Love is **Supportive** and considerate rather than self-centered.
- 10. Love is **Courtesy** and polite rather than rude.
- 11. Love is **Slow to Anger** and not easily provoked.
- 12. Love is **Trusting** and gives a new start to those who have sinned past.
- 13. Love is **Loyal**, endures to the end, and never gives up.

Also: Love doesn't Control others.

Galatians 5:22-23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."

Stress happens. You can't always prevent or avoid it. But you can change how you respond to it. Try these tips. You may feel better—and have a healthier heart, too!

Know How Stress Affects Your Body. Whether it's from everyday deadlines, the work-life balancing act, or financial struggles, stress shows up often. Your body reacts to it. Your heart rate increases, your blood vessels narrow—and especially over the long term that's not healthy!

Research shows that stress can make us more likely to get heart disease and have a heart attack. The origins of heart disease begin at a young age, so the earlier in life you learn how to de-stress, the happier you and your heart will be. Ongoing stress acts on more than just your heart. It affects everything from your nervous system and hormones to your lungs and gut. You may not see the connection, and healthcare providers may not ask about your stress. So, try to listen to your body while thinking about what's going on in your life.

Turn On Your Relaxation Response. Did you know your body also has a relaxation response? Your breathing slows and blood pressure and heart rate decrease. The good news is you can trigger that response. Ways to do so often combine breathing deeply and focusing your attention on pleasing thoughts and images. Here are a few relaxation response techniques to try. You can do these on your own or find a teacher or class to start.

- Progressive Muscle Relaxation This approach calls for tightening individual muscles in your body and then releasing the tension. Start by tensing and relaxing your toes, then your calves, and on up to your face. Do one muscle group at a time. Sit in a partially reclined position.
- Meditation This is one of the most-studied approaches for handling stress. There are a variety of ways to do it, including through mindfulness meditation. Most meditation styles involve: 1) Being in a quiet location with as few distractions as possible 2) Being physically comfortable either sitting, lying, or walking 3) Focusing your attention on a specific word or set of words, an object, or your breathing 4) Having an open attitude and letting distractions, including thoughts, come and go without judgment.
- Guided Imagery This involves a series of steps that include relaxing and visualizing the details of a calm, peaceful setting, such as a garden.
- Deep Breathing This is something you can do anytime, anywhere. Take in a slow, deep breath, let your stomach or chest expand, then exhale slowly. Repeat a few times.

Finding healthy relaxation exercises is just one way to protect your heart. Combine de-stressing with other heart-healthy habits: eat nutritious foods, move your body more and exercise, get enough sleep, and develop a strong social support system.



Stewardship - Part Two

It is important for us to know the standard for being good stewards of the Lord's work. That Standard is to be found only in the "Holy Bible" – God's Word.

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16-17 NKJV)

A steward is a <u>manager</u> or administrator. He takes care of other people's property, and is rewarded or punished for how well he does his job. Jesus used the idea of stewards in his parables (e.g., Luke 12:42, 16:3). Believers are stewards in that God has entrusted to them various resources, and He expects them to use them properly. To do so requires discipline. It's easy to squander what God has given, or to think that the things God gives are really one's own. But believers don't own anything. They are just taking care of or managing God's property (Matthew 25:21, Luke 16:10, 1 Corinthians 4:2, Colossians 4:17).

Biblical stewardship, also known as "Christian stewardship," is the practice of *selflessly* managing everything we have—our talents, time, money, relationships, health, etc.—for God's glory. It's been practiced for thousands of years, and its origins are captured in the many Bible verses about stewardship of money, time, and possessions.

Being a Good Steward of Our Time

Psalm 90:12 (NKJV) "So teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom."

Time is one of the most precious commodities we have, and it always seems to be in short supply. Jesus' life and ministry were relatively short, yet he made the most of his years here on earth. Likewise, the Bible commands us to make the most of our time, and to be good stewards of the time that God gives us.

The Psalmist's View of Time

Psalm 90 is filled with contrasts of the timelessness of God, who is from "everlasting to everlasting" and the temporal nature of people, who are "dust." The psalmist, in this case Moses, looks back and realizes how quickly life has passed by.

Moses used images to remind his readers of how brief life is. Psalm 90:3-6 "You turn man to destruction, and say, Return, O children of men. For a thousand years in Your sight are like yesterday when it is past, and like a watch in the night. You carry them away like a flood; they are like a sleep. In the morning they are like grass which grows up: In the morning it flourishes and grows up; In the evening it is cut down and withers."

Moses speaks of the average life expectancy being seventy years or eight, if we have the strength. "The days of our lives are seventy years; and if by reason of strength they are eighty years, yet their boast is only labor and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away." (vs. 10)

Given the fact that life passes by so quickly, the psalmist prays a prayer. "So teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." (vs. 12)

The Lord Jesus as a Steward of His Time

• The Lord Jesus' life was short, yet very significant. It lasted just thirty-three years—His ministry consisted of only three of those years. Yet in that short period of time, He impacted the world more than anyone else in

history. As we look at Jesus' life, we see Him extremely busy at times, yet always in control. We never see Him rushed or in a panic over how to manage His time. Throughout His ministry, Jesus is on a divine timetable (John 2:4; 7:6; 8:30; 8:20; 12:23; 13:1; 17:1), and He was able to accomplish everything that God gave Him to do.

- The Lord Jesus took time for worship and prayer. Mark 1:21-24, 35
- Throughout the Lord Jesus' ministry, we see Him setting aside time to spend with His Father. Look up the following verses on the high priority Jesus placed on spending time alone with God (Mark 6:46; Luke 4:16; 6:12; 9:18). We often use the excuse there is not enough time for worship or prayer. What does Jesus' example teach us?
- The Lord Jesus had a sense of urgency about His mission and ministry. John 4:30-36
- The Lord Jesus was aware of how short His time on earth would be. John 9:4-5
- The Lord Jesus took time for Himself. He also took time to nurture the physical and emotional needs of his disciples and himself. Mark 6:31-32

How do We Spend Our Time?

Ephesians 5:15-16 "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil."

Stewardship of Our Finances and Resources

Proverbs 3:9-10 "Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; so your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will overflow with new wine."

The Bible has a lot to say about managing our money and finances. More than 2,000 verses address a wide range of financial topics. The Bible is practical and accurate when it speaks about our financial stewardship. To the extent we follow the Scriptures, we profit. To the degree that we ignore them, we pay a stiff price.

What the Bible says about being a good steward of the finances God has entrusted to us and what the Bible says about the endless pursuit of wealth:

Proverbs 23:4-5 "Labor not to be rich: cease from thine own wisdom. Wilt thou set thine eyes upon that which is not? For riches certainly make themselves wings; they fly away as an eagle toward heaven." Proverbs 28:19-20 "He that tilleth his land shall have plenty of bread: but he that followeth after vain persons shall have poverty enough. A faithful man shall abound with blessings: but he that maketh haste to be rich shall not be innocent."

Ecclesiastes 5:10-12 "He who loves silver will not be satisfied with silver; nor he who loves abundance, with increase. This also is vanity. When goods increase, they increase who eat them; so what profit have the owners except to see them with their eyes? The sleep of a laboring man is sweet, whether he eats little or much; but the abundance of the rich will not permit him to sleep."

Proverbs 3:9-10 talks about giving God his rightful place in the area of our finances. "Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; so your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will overflow with new wine."

Read Haggai 1:2-11 and 1 Corinthians 16:1-2.

The Scriptures warn us about the danger of indebtedness:

- Proverbs 22:7 "The rich ruleth over the poor, And the borrower is servant to the lender."
- Proverbs 22:26-27 "Be not thou one of them that strike hands, or of them that are sureties for debts. If thou hast nothing to pay, why should he take away thy bed from under thee?"

The Scriptures teach us about the importance of saving:

- Proverbs 21:20 "There is treasure to be desired and oil in the dwelling of the wise; but a foolish man spendeth it up."
- Proverbs 13:11 "Wealth gotten by vanity shall be diminished: but he that gathereth by labour shall increase."
- Proverbs 30:24-25 "There be four things which are little upon the earth, but they are exceeding wise: the ants are a people not strong, yet they prepare their meat in the summer."

The Scriptures teach us about the secret and source of a Christian's contentment:

- Philippians 4:11-13 "Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content. I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me."
- Hebrews 13:5-6 "Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. So that we may boldly say, the Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me."

Stewardship and Tithing

Every Christian needs to know the standard for giving to the Lord's work. Those who do not, give haphazardly and spasmodically, guided only by attitudes, emotions and moods. God's standard for giving is to be found in the "Holy Bible".

As Christians, we are instructed by the Word of God – the Holy Bible- to bring 10% of our income to the church.

What is tithing?

The word "tithe" means a tenth: ...one tenth of the annual produce of one's land or its equivalent in money.

Genesis 14:20 – Abram gave tithes of all he had.

Genesis 28:22 – Jacob promised God a tenth, a tithe.

Leviticus 27:30 instructs us to give a tenth of land, fruit or seed, increase.

2 Chronicles 31:5 – The children of Israel brought tithes of all things.

The proper attitude of a Christian when it comes to tithing is to gladly bring a tenth or tithe of his income and possessions to the Lord's work.

2 Corinthians 9:7 "So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of [a]necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver."

To Whom does all your money and other possessions belong?

1 Timothy 6:7 "For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out."

God gives each of us the ability and skill to earn money; so, all that we have we owe to the Lord.

Haggai 2:8 "The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, saith the LORD of hosts."

Psalm 24:1 "The earth is the LORD's, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein."

When do you bring your tithe?

1 Corinthians 16:2 "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come."

The Bible plan is that you be systematic and regular in your giving.

Where do you bring your tithe?

Malachi 3:10 "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

The storehouse is God's house, the local church you attend, where you receive your spiritual food. The work of the local church is carried on by tithes and offerings given by God's people.

The Treasury

Luke 21:1-4 "And he looked up, and saw the rich men casting their gifts into the treasury. And he saw also a certain poor widow casting in thither two mites. And he said, Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all: for all these have of their abundance cast in unto the offerings of God: but she of her penury hath cast in all the living that she had."

What should be your attitude in giving?

2 Corinthians 9:7 "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver."

AN AFRICAN PASTOR'S STATEMENT ON WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A DISCIPLE

Recently, I was asked to share something for the monthly Newsletter. It didn't take long for the Holy Spirit to remind me of this statement and my reaction to it. I read this several years ago after completing a Discipleship Training Class. I've shared it before in other settings over the past few years. You may have heard or read it before. The statement can actually be found in the back of one of the books. I found it thought provoking, educational and inspiring. It was written by an African Pastor who was totally sold out for Jesus. I hope you're blessed as I was.

He says, "I'm part of the fellowship of the unashamed. I have Holy Spirit power. The die has been cast. I have stepped over the line. The decision has been made. I'm a disciple of His. I won't look back, let up, slow down, back away, or be still.

My past is redeemed, my present makes sense; my future is secure. I'm finished and done with low living, sight walking, small planning, smooth knees, colorless dreams, tamed visions, mundane talking, cheap living, and dwarfed goals.

I no longer need preeminence, prosperity, position, promotions, plaudits, or popularity. I don't have to be right, first, tops, recognized, praised, regarded, or rewarded. I now live by faith, lean on His presence, walk by patience, lift by prayer, and labor by power.

My face is set, my gait is fast, my goal is heaven, my road is narrow, my way is rough, my companions are few, my guide is reliable, my mission is clear. I cannot be bought, compromised, detoured, lured away, turned back, deluded, or delayed. I will not flinch in the face of sacrifice, hesitate in the presence of the adversary, negotiate at the table of the enemy, ponder at the pool of popularity, or meander in the maze of mediocrity.

I won't give up, shut up, let up, until I have stayed up, stored up, prayed up, paid up, and preached up for the cause of Christ. I am a disciple of Jesus. I must go till He comes, give till I drop, preach till all know, and work till He stops me.

And when He comes for His own, He will have no problem recognizing me – my banner will be clear."

This statement by a dedicated, fully committed preacher of the gospel is a clear example of how, if we are serious, and if we are sold out, we should be as servants of our God.

If you listened closely and were able to decipher in your own words, you could hear redemption, regeneration, hope, trust, prayer, faith and determination.

You didn't need to hear the word to know that he was totally and completely in love and he was committed to his relationship until the end.

It didn't take much to realize who the center of his joy is or that falling in love with Jesus was the best thing he'd ever done.

This Pastor let us know just how personal his relationship and conviction is.

At the end of this preacher's profession, the author of the lesson we'd been studying posed two questions, "Are you totally committed to Jesus? And, will He recognize you as His disciple because your banner is clear?"

My heart's desire is not to question you but to encourage you to receive the statement of this African Pastor in your spirit and to examine your relationship with our Lord even as I have done and am still doing, and, more importantly, "to be not conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." (Romans 12:2)

Even as I share this with you, I am reminding myself that it's easy to talk about what we believe but our actions speak far better than words so "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5:16) Allow the love of Christ to flow out of you to touch the heart of your sister or brother.

Finally, my prayer is that in whatever area of ministry He has equipped us to serve, whether we usher, whether we teach, whether the women's ministry, the men's ministry or the health ministry, the mothers' ministry or the deacons' ministry, whether outreach ministry or media ministry, whether Sunday School or Pastor's Aide, whether musician or choir member, we will do so to the glory of God. It doesn't matter where we're at; it doesn't matter what we're doing; it doesn't matter who we're with — the saint or the sinner. What matters is that we exhibit the same tenacity, conviction and determination so that all will know that we are undeniably God's own and nothing shall separate us from Him, not death nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come. We belong to Him and our lives ought to reflect that fact. This for me is a great declaration of love and I pray you receive it.

2021 TAX CHANGES (Important Changes for Individuals)

AARP Foundation <u>www.aarpfoundation.org</u>. The Foundation, a charitable affiliate of AARP, goals and missions are helping the 50+ community. It is an accredited charity $(501(c)\ 3)$ with the BBB. The Foundation has several programs that support its' missions and goals:

- SCSEP- Senior Community Service Employment Program
- Work for yourself@50+
- Back to work 50+
- Experience Corps
- Tax-Aide (provides free tax preparation, counseling and guidance to the population that needs the services, available year round, offers online tax assistance, offers services in your community and services are provided by trained, skilled and certified volunteers). The AARP Foundation Tax-Aide Program is offered nationwide either in-person or virtually based on location and the availability of volunteers. **The program begins in February 2022.** You can locate a facility in your neighborhood @ www.aarp.org/taxaide.

2021 Tax Law Updates (Individual Tax Filing)

- Recovery Rebate Credit: EIP3
- Child & Dependent Care Credit
- Earned Income Tax Credit

Recovery Rebate Credit (Economic Impact Payment #3)

- All EIP were advance payments: EIP1 & EIP2 (TY 20 under CARES)
- EIP3 under ARPA up to \$1,400 per person including qualified dependents, (college students, adults with disability, parents & grandparents)
- Income phase out: S \$75K, MFJ/SS \$150K, HH \$112,500
- RRC on your tax return and it's refundable
- What did you get? Notices 1444 & 1444B (TY20) 1444C (TY21)
- IRS Letter # 6475 confirming EIP3 for TY 21

Child & Dependent Care Credit

- Increased the amount of the credit: up to \$4,000 for one qualifying person and \$8,000 for two or more
- Eligible if you pay someone to care for your qualifying person(s)
- Qualifying person is: dependent under 13, spouse if mentally or physically unable to care for his/herself
- Credit is refundable if your main home is one of the 50 states or DC

Earned Income Tax Credit

- Designed for low & moderate income individuals
- Taxpayer(s) & qualifying children must have valid SSN & be a US citizen or permanent resident
- Must be at least 19 years old (was 25); cannot be a dependent on another return. Available to senior citizens (was to age 65)
- Available to taxpayers with and without qualifying children
- Calculate the credit based on 2019 if higher than 2021 income
- Married must file MFJ*

Child Tax Credit

- Increases the amount to \$3,000 per child (6-17); \$3,600 (5 and under)
- Fully refundable to eligible taxpayers
- Available if family(s) have little or no income
- Family received advance payments up to 1/2 of the credit
- IRS sends letter # 6419 in January 2022 with the total amount of advance payments

Credit for Sick Leave & Family Leave

- Eligible self-employed persons can take an income tax credit to offset federal self-employment tax
- Modified & extended for 2021
- File Form 7202
- Uses a calculation to determine the eligible amount if under Federal, State or local quarantine for COVID 19

2021 Tax Law Updates (Individual Filing)

- Increase in the standard deduction:
- S/MFS \$12,550; HH \$18,800 MFJ \$25,100
- Increase in charitable contribution deduction for taxpayers using the standard deduction S \$300 or MFJ \$600
- Medical expense deduction is 7.5% above AGI and is permanent

Tax liability is based on filing status. You must file a return if:

- Single under 65 earn \$12,550; 65 earn \$14,250
- HH under 65 \$18,800 65 earn \$20,500
- MFJ under 65 (both) \$25,100; 65 (one) \$26,450 65(both) \$27,800

S-Single MFS-Married Filing Single HH-Household MFJ-Married Filing Jointly

GOD WILL RENEW US!

The theme for the Women's Ministry in 2022 is "Renew in 2022"!

Renew means to resume (an activity) after interruption. Merriam Webster defines renew as to make like new; to make new spiritually; to do again, to begin again.

According to the King James Version, renew means: 1) to renovate, to restore; 2) to reestablish; 3) to make again; 4) to repeat (like to renew a promise; 5) to revive; 6) to begin again; 7) to make new, fresh or vigorous, like to renew youth, strength.

Often, when we begin a new year, people may ask, "What are your new year's resolutions?" We may feel pressure and stress to come up with resolutions, or maybe guilt and regret that we have not done, finished, or continued something. We do not have to feel any pressure—we can be renewed in 2022! God can refresh us, revive us, restore us and renew our strength! We can also renew our commitments to Him, to things He has asked us and called us to do. Wherever we "ended" in 2021, we do not have to "start all over again"; God can renew us right where we are.

Our lesson for January came from Isaiah 40:25-31. The Lord wanted to remind us of His promises and comfort us from His Word.

GOD IS STRONG IN POWER/ALL POWERFUL

In verse 25, God asks, "To whom then will ye liken Me, or shall I be equal? saith the Holy One." (KJV) He is asking, "To whom will you compare Me, that I would be his equal?" (AMP). To whom do we compare God? Who is equal to God? Our friends? Our family? When we worry about a problem, to whom are we comparing Him? God wants us to remember that He is the Almighty God, the All Powerful (Omnipotent) God. There is no one that is equal to God or greater than God. He has all power!

The Lord said in verse 26, to lift your eyes and look to the heavens. Who created all of this? He brings out the starry host like an army (NLT) and He calls them forward by name. He created all of the millions of stars in the heavens by His Word and He calls each of them by name. The verse goes on to say that because He is strong in power, because of the greatness of His might and the strength of His power (AMP), not one is missing. The order and display of the stars reflect God's great power and might; none of the stars fail to appear or fail to do what He tells them to do. To whom will you compare Me?

Verse 27 states, "Why sayest thou, O Jacob, and speakest, O Israel, my way is hid from the Lord, and my judgment is passed over from my God?" (KJV) God asks, through the prophet Isaiah, why do you say God doesn't see me? God doesn't see what I'm going through? Why do we say He doesn't see my tears, hear my prayers, see my situation? Why do we say the justice we are due has escaped God's notice (AMP)? Why do you say the Almighty God, who created the stars and knows them by name, who spread the heavens like a curtain, and who made you does not see you? In the next verse, the Lord begins to answer the question He asked in verse 27---with a question and a reassuring statement.

GOD DOES NOT GET TIRED

In verse 28, God asks (for the 2nd time in this chapter), "Have you not known? Have you not heard?..." God is the Everlasting God; He is eternal, lives forever, and in Whom there is no deficiency. He is the Lord, which means Jehovah, the I AM, the Self-Existent One. He is the Creator of the ends of the earth, of the whole earth. The scripture says God fainteth not, meaning He does not get tired, fatigued or exhausted. God neither is weary, does not get or feel tired, and is not exhausted in strength, endurance, vigor. God does not get tired! We get tired, we feel exhausted at times, but He never gets tired! He has all strength and power! Then He says, "...there is no searching of His understanding"; His understanding is limitless. God is saying He is the Eternal God who made this whole world and everything in it. He sees us, He understands exactly how we feel and cares about everything we are going through. He is not too tired or weak to take care of us and everything that concerns us.

Verse 29 says God gives power to those who are faint, who are fatigued and exhausted. God increases strength to those who are weak, who have no strength. He is the infinite source of power. Even the youths, as mentioned in verse 30, who are in the strongest times of their lives, will grow weary in their own strength. Even the young men, who may have strength and endurance, will stumble and fall without God's strength.

GOD WILL RENEW OUR STRENGTH (VS. 31)

"But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength..." Wait means expect, look for, hope in.

Expect = to believe something will happen and will arrive soon.

<u>Look for</u> = to direct one's gaze toward something or someone in a specified direction; to hope to get something wanted or needed.

<u>Hope in</u> = a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen; a feeling of trust. Confident expectation.

God reminded us that He wants us to expect Him to show up and move on our behalf, to look to and cast our eyes on Him, knowing He is for us, and to hope in Him, to have a feeling of trust and confident expectation in Him. He is for us and is working everything out for our good and for His glory!

The word "renew" in this passage means "to exchange". So, that means we will exchange our weakness for His strength and power!

"They shall mount up with wings as eagles..." Like the eagle flies high above the storm and high in the heavens, so will God cause us to rise high above our troubles, situations and circumstances. Eagles are known for their strength, good health and speed; they live to a great age, beyond other birds, and renew their feathers even in old age. God can renew our strength no matter our age! Nothing is too hard for Him!

"They shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint." We can run this race with God's strength and not get tired. We can walk with the Lord and not get weak. Our Almighty God will renew our strength!

The meeting began with fellowship and intercessory prayer. We ended with prayer requests and prayer. We are excited and looking forward to all God will do this year. **Renew in 2022!**





African Americans are also living longer, and most of them have some form of health insurance coverage. However, African Americans still experience illness and infirmity at extremely high rates and have lower life expectancy than other racial and ethnic groups. They are also one of the most economically disadvantaged demographics in this country.

Disparities still exist across health conditions when comparing African Americans and whites, including maternal mortality, infant mortality, heart disease, diabetes, cancer, and other health issues. Social factors, including economic disadvantage, inequities in education, and lack of access to health care, impact a person's ability to lead a healthy and productive life. For people in American society that experience racism and inequality in their daily lives, and throughout the lifespan, the impact of social factors on health are the gravest.

The American health care system is beset with inequalities that have a disproportionate impact on people of color and other marginalized groups. These inequalities contribute to gaps in health insurance coverage, uneven access to services, and poorer health outcomes among certain populations. African Americans bear the brunt of these health care challenges.

When it comes to income, gains have been made as well, but African Americans are still paid less than white Americans for the same jobs and lag significantly behind when it comes to accumulating wealth. And as for home ownership, just over 40 percent of African Americans own a home—a rate virtually unchanged since 1968.







National Black Anthem






Emissions required for 1998 to 2019 model years

For 2022, all gasoline-powered cars and light-duty trucks 8,500 pounds or less with the model years 1998 through 2019 require an emissions test to register and renew. For testing locations, senior exemptions, and other information, visit <u>CleanAirForce.com</u>. Once your vehicle has been tested, renew online at GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Renew.

Are you 65 as of January 1?
