Dear Members and Friends,

I greet you in the matchless name of Jesus Christ our Lord. The Lord has blessed us to enter into a brand new year. 

A thirst for God keeps us focused on Him, for only the Living Water, the Lord Jesus Christ, can satisfy our soul. A thirst for God keeps us dependent upon Him. It's when we become independent of the Lord that we get into trouble. We think other things can fill and quench the thirst in our lives, only to find out later we were wrong. A thirst for God keeps us at His nail-scarred feet, praying for His power to serve, for patience to endure, for persistence when we fail, for purity when we are tempted, and for purpose when we are pulled by distractions or discouragement.

How do I get a craving thirst for God? What does the Lord use to get His people to this point in their lives? I've discovered through our study of Psalm 42 that God will use both pleasant and unpleasant things to create a thirst in us for Him. He came to America in 1890 where he worked for ten years for the New York Central & Hudson R.R. Co., then served for twelve years as superintendent of the Mohawk and Hudson River Humane Society. He began writing songs and hymns about 1896 and was a prolific writer of gospel verse with more than 9,000 published hymns, poems, recitations, and other works.


The Origin of Black History Month. The story of Black History Month begins in 1915, half a century after the Thirteenth Amendment abolished slavery in the United States. As a Harvard-trained historian, Carter G. Woodson, like W. E. B. Du Bois before him, believed that truth could not be



will stay in it.

denied, and that reason would prevail over prejudice. His hopes to raise awareness of African American's contributions to civilization was realized when he and the organization he founded, the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), conceived and announced Negro History Week in 1925. The event was first celebrated during a week in February 1926 that encompassed the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln (12th) and Frederick Douglass (14th).

He envisioned the study and celebration of the Negro as a race, not simply as the producers of a great man. And Lincoln, however great, had not freed the slaves — the Union Army, including hundreds of thousands of Black soldiers and sailors, had done that. Instead of focusing on two men, the Black community, he believed, should focus on the countless Black men and women



In fact, Woodson never viewed black history as a one-week affair. He pressed for schools to use Negro History Week to demonstrate what students learned all year. Throughout the 1930s, Negro History Week countered the growing myth of the South's "lost cause", as epitomized in both the novel and the movie Gone with The Wind. That myth argued that slaves had been well-treated, that the Civil War was a war of "northern aggression", and that blacks had been better off under slavery. Woodson wrote in his book The Miseducation of the American Negro, "When you control a man's

In the 1940s, efforts began slowly within the black community to expand the study of black history in the schools and black history celebrations before the public. In the decades that followed, mayors of cities across the country began issuing yearly proclamations recognizing "Negro History Week." By the late 1960s, thanks in part to the civil rights movement and a growing awareness of Black identity, "Negro History Week" had evolved into Black History Month on many college campuses, but it was 50 years before Black History Week was expanded to Black History Month.

thinking you do not have to worry about his actions", "You do not have to tell him not to stand here or go yonder. He will find his 'proper place' and




In 1976 the association that Woodson had founded (later renamed the Association for the Study of African American Life and History) facilitated the widespread institutionalization of February as Black History Month, and U.S. President Gerald Ford urged Americans to participate in its observance. All subsequent presidents would do the same, sometimes referring to the event as National Afro-American (Black) History Month or National African American History Month.

Other countries started celebrating Black History Month sometime later, The United Kingdom in 1987, Canada in 1995. Since its inception, Black

History Month has expanded beyond its initial acceptance in educational establishments. In 2018, Instagram created its first-ever Black History Month hashtag. By 2020, Black History Month had become a focus beyond schools. The Wall Street Journal describes it as "a time when the culture and contributions of African Americans take center stage" in a variety of cultural institutions including theaters, libraries, and museums. It has also garnered attention from the U.S. business community. In February 2020 Forbes noted that "much of corporate America is commemorating" Black History Month, including The Coca-Cola Company and Wall Street.

On February 21, 2016, 106-year Washington D.C. resident and school volunteer Virginia McLaurin visited the White House as part of Black History Month. When asked by the president why she was there, McLaurin said, "A Black president. A Black wife. And I'm here to celebrate Black history. That's what I'm here for."





#### **VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE**

As the election season kicks in, it's important to register to vote now. To be eligible, Georgia residents need to be U.S. citizens, legal residents of their voting county, and at least 18 years of age by Election Day. The deadline to register to vote and be eligible to cast a ballot in the March 12<sup>th</sup> Presidential Preference Primary is Monday, February 12<sup>th</sup>.

Check your registration status, download a voter registration application, view sample ballots, and locate your polling location at <a href="MVP.SOS.GA.gov">MVP.SOS.GA.gov</a>.

#### **GET AFFORDABLE INTERNET ACCESS FOR YOUR HOME**

You may qualify for a \$30 monthly discount on your home or mobile internet service through the Federal Communications Commission Affordable Connectivity Program. Gwinnett is encouraging eligible residents to claim this new benefit and start saving on internet service. Visit <a href="Methodology: AffordableConnectivity.gov">AffordableConnectivity.gov</a> or call 877-384-2575 to learn about eligibility and apply. Then, contact a participating broadband provider to start receiving your monthly discount.

#### **REVITALIZE YOUR HOME**

Gwinnett's offering up to \$20,000 in housing rehabilitation assistance to income-qualified homeowners in Gwinnett County. The Homeowner Housing Rehabilitation Program offers funding to make essential repairs to their homes. The goal of the program is to address health and safety issues for qualifying homeowners, focusing on vital life systems of a home such as electrical, roof, and plumbing.

To qualify for the program, homeowners must be current on mortgage and tax payments, maintain the residence as their primary owner-occupied property, and earn below 80 percent of Area Median Income.
