THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST

The resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday is the cornerstone of the Christian faith, signifying the fulfillment of God's plan for redemption and offering believers the promise of eternal life. It is a day of immense joy and hope, as Christians celebrate the victory of light over darkness, life over death, and the triumph of God's love for humanity. Easter Sunday serves as a profound reminder of the transformative power of faith and the enduring message of hope that resonates throughout the ages.

Easter is considered the most important and joyful celebration in the Christian liturgical calendar. It is a time for Christians to reflect on the significance of Jesus' sacrifice and the promise of eternal life. The resurrection is seen as a central doctrine of Christianity, emphasizing the hope and redemption offered through faith in Jesus Christ.

The significance of Easter is Jesus Christ's triumph over death. His resurrection means the eternal life that is granted to all who believe in Him. The purpose of Easter also means the full confirmation of all that Jesus taught and preached during His three-year ministry. If He had not risen from the dead or simply died and not been resurrected, He would have been thought of as just another teacher or prophet. However, His resurrection rebuked all that and provided final and undeniable proof that He was the Son of God and that He had overcome death once and for all.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the core of the Christian gospel. Saint Paul says that if Christ is not raised from the dead, then our preaching and hope are in vain (1 Cor. 15:14). Certainly, without the resurrection, there would be no Christian preaching or faith. The apostles of Christ would have continued as the disheartened group, which the Gospel of John depicts as being in hiding for fear of the Jews. They were in total despair until they met the risen Christ (John 20:19). Then they touched Christ's wounds of the nails and the spear; they are and drank with Him.



The resurrection became the foundation of everything they said and did (<u>Acts 2-4</u>): "... for a spirit has not flesh and bones as you see that I have" (<u>Luke 24:39</u>).

The resurrection affirms Jesus of Nazareth as the prophesied Messiah of Israel and the King and Lord of a new Jerusalem: a new heaven and a new earth.



³ For I handed down to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures.

HYMN OF THE MONTH



Elisha Albright Hoffman's life had just taken a new turn when he wrote "Glory to His Name" in 1878, probably a transition he hadn't wanted to endure. How would he

manage as a widower at the time of one of his early writing efforts with three kids—adjusting to single parenting? What would you or I do in such a situation? Is it possible that God heard the words Elisha wrote as a pledge of loyalty, and that He crafted a response—perhaps even a reward--for this servant whose heart must have been broken?

Elisha Hoffman had been a lover of music directed vertically since his childhood, and would remain so for a lifetime, even as he was challenged at one point. In the Pennsylvania community in which he was reared, Hoffman learned the love of music from parents and the church in which he was



nurtured. He was the son on an evangelical minister, so it wasn't a surprise that he devoted his adult life to ministry. Before his ordained ministry, however, he worked for just over a decade with a publishing house, a period which must have also spawned his lifetime energy as an editor of songbooks (he edited some 50 songbooks over his life). He'd been in ministry just three years when his wife died, leaving him alone with three sons as a 37-year old in 1876, perhaps the pivotal point in his life. It was in this period prior to his 40th birthday that he wrote the words for "Glory to His Name." Reading the words, it is not apparent if he was struggling with the recent turn of events, but instead quite the opposite. He's clinging to the Holy Redeemer with devotion, an appreciation of his eternal assurance. Could his wife's death have crystallized something, perhaps bonded him stronger still to his God, even if his upbringing, education, and ordination had informed him of His presence as one would expect? Perhaps this time was a crucible for Elisha, wherein he discovered the glue he had with God was deeper and much more meaningful, an unbreakable thing. Is it just coincidental that Hoffman wrote the words in 1878, and remarried the following year? Or, that he went on to minister, beginning in 1880, in three churches over the next 42 years, and composed over 2,000 hymns, most of them in that four-decade stretch? What would you say?

What is the way to respond to a personal crisis? What prepares one for it, or does it happen randomly? Ask Job. He may have endured more than 10 believers are supposed to suffer. Elisha Hoffman must have had moments when he too cried out in despair as his 40th anniversary on earth approached, yet his words in 1878 sound like a man who had decided he was "all in" with this God.

SIGNS OF THE SEASON

Fall Back, Spring Thead, and Lift Him Up!

Jesus said, *And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.* John 12:32 KJV. This scripture can be interpreted as pick up or raise someone or something from a lower position. John 12:32 is further explained in John 6:44-45. John 6:44-45 KJV ⁴⁴ No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will



raise him up at the last day. ⁴⁵ It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me.

Jesus' Resurrection is celebrated in the Spring which is synonymous with new life. To me, this is the most wonderful time of the year. I know... it's not Christmas, which is when you usually hear this but, isn't this season of renewal and Resurrection just wonderful?

Resurrection Sunday is when we (Christians) celebrate Jesus' triumphant victory over death. Three days after being crucified on the cross and buried in a borrowed tomb, Jesus rose from the dead and ascended to Heaven, seated at the right hand of the Father. Hallelujah -- that is great news and, indeed for some, "the most wonderful time of the year!"

Rebirth and rejuvenation in the springtime shows up as dormant trees and grass growing and reproducing; coming back to life from the cold winter season. Animals come out of hibernation and begin their nesting and reproductive activities. As Christians, we are given new life and new mercies every morning.

Consider these four R's of springtime and rebirth—

- Raise to set upright by lifting or building; to place higher in rank or dignity (elevate)*
- Renewal the act of renewing: the state of being renewed*
- Resurrection the rising of Christ from the dead*
- Risen to move upward (ascend)*

As you reflect on the Resurrection of our Risen Lord and Savior, meditate on the scriptures below related to the Spring.

- ¹⁴ That I will give you the rain of your land in his due season, the first rain and the latter rain, that thou mayest gather in thy corn, and thy wine, and thine oil. **Deuteronomy 11:14 KJV**
- ⁴ And they shall spring up as among the grass, as willows by the water courses. **Isaiah 44:4 KJV**
- ¹ Ask ye of the Lord rain in the time of the latter rain; so the Lord shall make bright clouds, and give them showers of rain, to every one grass in the field. **Zechariah 10:1 KJV**
- ¹¹ For, lo, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone; ¹² The flowers appear on the earth; the time of the singing of birds is come, and the voice of the turtle is heard in our land;
- ¹³ The fig tree putteth forth her green figs, and the vines with the tender grape give a good smell. Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away.

Women's History Month "A Celebration of Women"

With March being the month that women are internationally celebrated, we can look to God's Word for the loveliest homage of them all. Proverbs chapter 31 is a beautiful, heartfelt celebration of Godly women - the apples of God's eye!

Proverbs 31:10-31 (NKJV)

"Who can find a virtuous wife? For her worth is far above rubies. The heart of her husband safely trusts her; So he will have no lack of gain. She does him good and not evil All the days of her life. She seeks wool and flax, And willingly works with her hands. She is like the merchant ships, She brings her food from afar. She also rises while it is yet night, And provides food for her household, And a portion for her maidservants. She considers a field and buys it; From her profits she plants a vineyard. She girds herself with strength, And strengthens her arms. She perceives that her merchandise is good, And her lamp does not go out by night. She stretches out her hands to the distaff, And her hand holds the spindle. She extends her hand to the poor, Yes, she reaches out her hands to the needy. She is not afraid of snow for her household, For all her household is clothed with scarlet. She makes tapestry for herself; Her clothing is fine linen and purple. Her husband is known in the gates, When he sits among the elders of the land. She makes linen garments and sells them, And supplies sashes for the merchants. Strength and honor are her clothing; She shall rejoice in time to come. She opens her mouth with wisdom, And on her tongue is the law of kindness. She watches over the ways of her household, And does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children rise up and call her blessed; Her husband also, and he praises her: "Many daughters have done well, But you excel them all." Charm is deceitful and beauty is passing, But a woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised. Give her of the fruit of her hands, And let her own works praise her in the gates."

Perhaps one of the most striking verses is verse 25 which reads, "Strength and honor are her clothing: She shall rejoice in time to come." (NKJV) Strength and honor: two characteristics more befitting than any clothing item, and more breathtaking than even the rarest of diamonds! The Word gives many examples of strong, honorable women. In Romans 16:1-2, we learn of Phoebe, God's noble servant in the church of Cenchrea. She was a helper of many-including Paul, who instructed the Romans to treat her in a manner worthy of the saints because of her service. Acts 9:36 introduces us to Dorcas, a woman full of good deeds and charitable works--such as making garments for the local widows! And Judges 4:4 tells us about Deborah, a respected prophetess and judge.

Another great verse in Proverbs chapter 31 is verse 30 which reads, "Charm is deceitful and beauty is passing, But a woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised." (NKJV) Here, God teaches us that worldly charm or fleeting beauty should not be the focus of a woman of God. Rather, we are to seek and fear the Lord in all His majesty! Rahab is a woman in the Bible of whom we can look to as an example of a woman who feared the Lord. Considered one of the lowest members of her community, Rahab's fear of the Lord was greater than her fear of her king, and led her to save herself and her family from Joshua and the Israelites. God touched Rahab's heart out of love, regardless of her past sins. Rahab responded to that touch with a fearful respect of the Lord that superseded anyone and everything else. Listed above are but a few of the many amazing women that we meet throughout God's Word. The Bible speaks of many other women that served, were used by, and loved by our Father. All of God's children are fearfully and wonderfully made, man or woman. (Psalm 139:14 NKJV)



However, how sweet and full is God's love for His daughters! He holds our value far above even rubies; that is truly worth celebrating! (*Proverbs 31:10 NKJV*)

SPOTLIGHT: SHIRLEY CHISHOLM




Shirley Anita St. Hill Chishlom, otherwise known as Shirley Chisolm, was born November 3, 1924 in Brooklyn, New York.

During her life, she was a member of the New York State Assembly from January 1, 1965 - December 31, 1968. In 1972, she was the 1st African American woman in Congress, and the first woman and African American to seek the nomination for President of the United States from one of two major political parties. Her bid was unsuccessful, but her candidacy

allowed her to raise critical issues of importance to African Americans and women while forging the way for others.

She was a member of the House of Representatives from New York's 12th district from January 3, 1969 - January 3, 1983. She also served as the secretary of the House Democratic Caucus from January 3, 1977 - January 3, 1981. These are just some of the many roles and offices she held throughout her life.

Chisholm passed in 1985 at 80 years old, but her legacy continues to inspire African Americans and women today.



Florence Griffith Junior, more commonly known as Flo Jo, was born on December 24, 1959, in Los Angeles, California. She began running at the early age of 7, training with her father in the desert by chasing jack-rabbits to improve her speed. At the age of 14, she won the Jesse Owens National Youth Games and went on to break many high school records. She had to stop running at the age of 19 to take care of her family, but was later given the opportunity to run at the College of UCA.

She became an NCAA champion in 1982 with a victory in the 200m

dash. The following year, she took the top spot in the 400m dash. During the 1984 Olympics, she won silver in the 200m dash and quickly became a media icon with her dazzling fingernails and unique, custom running shoes.

In 1987, she married Al Joyner, Olympic triple jump gold-medalist, and later selected him to be her coach. In 1988 Summer Olympics, Flo Jo won 3 gold medals - 4x100m dash, the 100m and 200m dashes, as well as a silver medal in the 4x100 meter relay. She is the current world record holder for the women's 100m (10.49 sec) and 200m (21.34 sec) dash. She once said, "Believe in yourself and all that you are, and know that there is something inside of you that is greater than any obstacle." Unfortunately, she passed away on September 21, 1998, at the age of 38.

Nevertheless, her accomplishments in the sport of Track & Field continue to inspire young Black athletes all over the world.



SPOTLIGHT: RICHARD SPIKES



Richard Spikes was a prolific inventor born on October 2, 1878. He invented the automatic gear shift, the automatic brake system, directional signals, and car washers.

His inventions transformed the transportation industry, but he also innovated in other fields as well.

Spikes created the spinning barber chair and the beer keg tap. His eyesight began to fade due to glaucoma and, therefore, he created a drafting machine for people who were blind. Unlike most people at the time, he was blessed enough to patent all of his inventions. Many major companies welcomed his inventions which earned him over \$100,000 - an incredibly large sum of money for a black man in the 1930s. He was one of the highest earning black men of his time period.

Spike died on January 22, 1963, at the age of 84, but the impact of his engineering brilliance would continue to support our society for decades to come.





women who found peace in not only sitting on their porches and backyards, but decorating them and sharing ideas and decor.

Matthew Whitaker is a 22 year old pianist, born April 3, 2001, in New Jersey. He was diagnosed with blindness at birth and learned how to play the piano at the early age of three years old.

When Whitaker was 10, he was invited to perform in front of Stevie Wonder at the Apollo Theater. When he was 13, he became the youngest musician in history to be endorsed by Hammond as a jazz pianist.

Whitaker attended the Manhattan School of Music's Pre-college Jazz Program and has since performed on many great stages including the United Nations Headquarters, the Lincoln Center, and the JFK Center.

He is currently furthering his talents in the Jazz Studies program at The Juilliard School.

ACT PREP TEST FROM A STUDENT PERSPECTIVE

A few weeks ago, I was offered by the Education Ministry to take the ACT Prep Test. The ACT is a standardized test that colleges use to evaluate students for admission. The test measured my skills in subjects of English, Math, Reading and Science. The duration was about 3-4 hours long and was divided into sections for each subject. Between every two sections, the students were given 10-minute rest breaks to clear their mind before the next section started.

While taking the test, I was anxious. There were some materials on the test I was familiar with, and some parts I was not. When the test ended, I was relieved it was finally over, but appreciative that I got the opportunity to see and prepare for this test. Overall, the ACT helped me to identify my strengths and areas for improvement.

The testing opportunity helped her realize the prep work she needs to succeed at the ACT for college. She was able to see what her strengths and weaknesses were on the test. I am so glad she had the opportunity to take the ACT Prep Test, especially because her plans are to attend college after high school and most colleges require either the ACT or SAT. Shenise also enjoyed the breakfast and lunch as well.

As a parent, you want to give your child every opportunity to successfully reach their goals, because of the free ACT testing, you have helped me keep Shenise on track without causing financial strain on my household in this economy. I was also able to see her first reaction after taking the test. Because she takes her test at school, I normally do not get to see this first reaction, and we were able to discuss the test immediately.

By offering this test, you also made sure that when she takes the ACT for college entry, it is not her first time seeing the test and this helps remove some of the testing jitters our kids face. Most of the time, when the kids are confident going to take the test, they score well. Please keep offering this free ACT testing for our youth because they need it, and the parents need the help in giving their child this opportunity.
