HIGHLIGHTING BLACK HISTORY

John Morton Finney

JUNE 25, 1889 - JANUARY 28, 1998

BUFFALO SOLDIER AND STUDIED LAW



John was born in Uniontown, Kentucky to a father (George) who was a slave and his mother (Maryatta) who was a free woman in June 1889. John's mother passed away in 1903 when John was just 15 years old. John's father could not care for him and his six siblings, so they moved to Missouri to live with their grandparents on their farm.

After high school John enrolled in Lincoln College in Jefferson City, Missouri but was interrupted and joined the army, the 24th U.S. Infantry Regiment, known as the Buffalo Soldiers and served in the Philippines. Morton was promoted to corporal and sergeant but was denied an officer's rank due to racial discrimination. John served in WWI as a infantryman in the American Expeditionary Force in France and served in WWII directing rationing programs to African American soldiers in Indianapolis.

When John finished his tour in the Philippines, he returned to Lincoln College in 1914 to obtain his undergraduate degree in 1918. John had undergraduate degrees from Lincoln College, Iowa State University, and Butler University. He obtained law degrees from Lincoln College, Indiana University and Martin University. John also obtained his master's degree from Indiana University in French. John could speak fluent French, Latin, Greek, and Spanish. He was conversational in Portuguese and German.

Not only did John pursue education most of his life but he also taught, from high school level to college. John taught at Fisk University and Lincoln College. When John moved back to Indianapolis, he started teaching in the Indianapolis Public Schools and taught for 37 years. He taught languages (Greek, Latin, Spanish), mathematics, and social studies, and served as a principal in different schools within the IPS.



With multiple law degrees John practiced law for 60+ years. At the age of 107 Morton was believed to be the oldest person in the United States practicing law. John was admitted to the bar of the Indianapolis Supreme Court in 1935 and the U.S. District Court of the United States in 1941. At the age of 83 in 1972 John was admitted to practice in front of the U.S. Supreme Court, STATE OF INDIANA EX REL. JOHN MORTON-FINNEY v. BOARD OF SCHOOL.

John was married to his wife Pauline for 52 years and they had one daughter, Gloria Ann. When John died in 1998 he was given full military honors and was buried in Crown Hill Cemetery.

He is Risen.


































































Pre-K - 2nd Grade Paint & Sip


